## GRADE LEVEL HAPPENINGS

### PRE-KINDERGARTEN

We've had a fun month in pre-k talking about the life cycle of a pumpkin! Ask your children to tell you how a pumpkin grows!

Mrs. May came to our class and helped us explore the inside of a pumpkin! We also launched a Creative Curriculum study all about

balls. Thank you to all of our families who sent in balls for us to use during this study. It has been so much fun using our thinking skills to investigate, ask questions, problem solve, and make predictions!



### KINDERGARTEN

Kindergartners are excited to begin exploring shapes in their next Eureka math module. They will learn to name and describe various 2D and 3D shapes (triangle, circle, rectangle, hexagon, square, cone, cube, sphere, cylinder). A good activity to support this at home is to play I Spy. Not only are they exploring shapes this month but they are also exploring poetry - what it looks and sounds like.

## FIRST GRADE

In Reading, we have just started our Fiction Unit. We will learn about the story elements and retelling fiction texts. Students will also learn how to compare and contrast characters throughout a story and determine character traits. We will learn about what lesson the author wants us to learn by looking through the lense of the characters and making personal connections.



In Writing, we are beginning our Narrative Unit. Students will make many personal connections as we read mentor texts to inspire their own writing. We will write about a special person, a place that is important to us, and traditions that we cherish. Students will go through the writing process by writing a clear beginning, middle and end. After writing students will select one piece to publish just as a writer would do.

In Math, students will be finishing Module 1 and moving into Module 2. Students will bridge from problem solving to 10 to work within 100. We will begin to solve problems in addition and subtraction problems involving teen numbers. Students will learn how to compose and decompose a ten to begin understanding place value and its relation in addition and subtraction.

In Social Studies, we will begin the month learning about Veterans Day. We will move into a study on Native Americans by looking at their rituals and history. We will finish by talking about the First Thanksgiving and compare it to how we celebrate Thanksgiving today.

We learned about pumpkins in science. Students learned about what pumpkins need to grow and their parts. Students identified the parts of the pumpkin and then counted the seeds by putting them in groups of 10! We found 334 seeds in one pumpkin!

In the picture, students were looking at nonfiction illustrations to find more information that they did not read in the text.



## SECOND GRADE

As the month of October unfolded, second graders explored place value and measurement, author studies with great books by Dav Pilkey and Kevin Henkes, cultural diversity and Hispanic Heritage Month, and science explorations around the concept of sound vibrations.

## THIRD GRADE

3rd grade enjoyed traveling for their first field trip this year to Downtown Wilmington! We got to visit many historic sites and some of us even got to meet the mayor of Wilmington! We are excited to begin our Fiction Reading Unit and are looking forward to our upcoming field trip to Airlie Gardens. Science this month will be out of this world as we explore Earth in our Solar System. We can't wait to keep learning together.

## FOURTH GRADE

Fourth Grade just started the Fiction Unit in Reading. We will be learning all about the different types of Fiction. In Writing we will begin our Cynthia Rylant Unit. Students will be reading a variety of Fiction Text by this author and will be able to write a friendly letter to the author, Cynthia Rylant, discussing one of their favorite stories that she wrote!



In Math students are learning a range of strategies to solve Multiplication and Division problems. Students will then apply these to multi-step Word Problems.

We are wrapping up our Electric Circuits Unit in Science. The kids have really loved the hands-on experiments with trying to create different types of electric circuits!

In October, students celebrated Unity Day by flooding the school with orange! Each day students make the decision to be kind to one another and make an effort to stop bullying!

## PEOPLE OF THE PAST FIELD TRIP - FOURTH GRADE

4th Grade really enjoyed the People of the Past Field Trip at the Cape Fear Museum. We learned how people in this area dressed and danced long ago. We also learned about fossils and artifacts that have been discovered in this area. These items taught us about the tools that the Native American tribes and the very first European explorers used. We had the opportunity to smell tar and pitch that was made from Pine trees. I think we most enjoyed hearing about how schools were long ago. We were able to write on slate boards and erase with a little piece of cotton. It was a great opportunity to learn about the people of North Carolina's past and how they played such a tremendous role in the things we do each day.



## FIFTH GRADE

In reading 5th grade is launching our Reading Fundamentals Fiction Unit. Students will learn the different genres of fiction, in addition to building on each literary standard for this unit.

In social studies students have been learning about the Indigenous People culture, along with the American Indian Government and Trade. Starting this week, students will engage in activities learning about the Colonies and their Founding.

In math, we completed Module I (comparing and ordering decimals) and have started Module II (multiplying and dividing whole numbers using the standard algorithm). It is extremely

important for each student to practice math fact fluency each night.

In science, we have completed our Force and Motion Unit. Students were engaged in hands on activities which allowed them to experiment as a Scientist. In addition to the classroom experiments, students were involved in the StarBase Program, which involved a plethora of STEM activities with a rocket launch (each student had a rocket) at the end of the week.

## STARBASE LANDED IN FIFTH GRADE!

Starbase is an educational program, sponsored by the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Manpower and Reserve Affairs. Students participate in challenging "hands-on, minds-on" activities in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. During Starbase, the students learned about Force and Motion, Coding and Robotics, Navigation and Mapping, Matter, Fluid Mechanics, Energy Fundamentals, Measurement and Stem Careers. 
## MESSAGE FROM MRS. MOORE

SAFETY IS OUR TOP PRIORITY


