CollegeBoard AP Honor Roll

For the third consecutive year, NISD has been named to College Board's AP Honor Roll for increased participation and performance in advanced

placement courses. In 2016, NISD high school students (and parents) saved more than \$3.5 million on college tuition by taking AP exams.

Creating Our Digital Footprint

Approximately 15,000 Chromebooks were deployed to students in third through twelfth grades. The 1:1 device use is not new to NISD, as students have used netbooks and iPads since 2009. In 2016, third through fifth grade classrooms added full class sets of Chromebooks to begin creation of an ePortfolio that will be maintained and updated until graduation. The device prepares all students to learn how to interact with a global audience, present, publish and collobarate on digital work, as well as build technology application skills.

The center features a great hall and large pavilion used for meeting and classroom spaces, as well as lookout and wetland pavilions for students to see water and erosion in its habitats.

Leo Adams was a founding member of the NISD school board, owned Justin Lumber Company and served as mayor of Justin for more than 10 years.
