

Overview: The study of creative writing allows students to develop versatility as a writer through forms such as short stories, poetry, drama, and screenwriting. All students are expected to demonstrate an understanding of creative development, the writing process, criticism, and various means of publication. The students’ evaluation of their own writing and others’ ensures that students can analyze and discuss published and unpublished pieces of writing, develop peer and self-assessments for effective writing, and set their own goals as writers.
