



Course Name: Student Government and Leadership
School Year: 2021-2022

Course Purpose and Relevance:

This elective course is designed to enhance student leadership and to develop problem-solving and critical-thinking skills. Topics include: parliamentary procedures; meeting skills; leadership development; goal setting; group dynamics; human relations skills; team building; communication skills; and civic responsibility. This course utilizes curriculum from TASSP/TASC.

The student

- uses problem-solving and decision-making skills, working independently and with others, in a variety of settings
- applies critical-thinking skills to organize and use information acquired from a variety of valid sources, including electronic technology.
- creates written, oral, and visual presentations of social studies information.
