Reading Corner....

During reading sessions in our academy, we use **VIPERS** to help children build their comprehension skills. **VIPERS** is an acronym for the various skills children need to master. Keep an eye on the Reading Corner each week for some ideas you can use at home!

This week's focus will be V which stands for **VOCABULARY**. Here are some ideas you can try at home:

Pick a word from their book and come up with words that rhyme with it. Pick a word and find other words that start with the same sound.

Draw a picture of one of the words in your book.

Come up with some synonyms and antonyms for a word from their book. Make a list of great verbs from the book and act them out in a silly way. Keep a list of great, new words and encourage your child to try and use them in their writing.

Look up a tricky word together in a dictionary or thesaurus and try to use it as often as possible, sometimes in silly ways throughout the week.
