The district's boundary committee has developed 3 elementary boundary change options to address growth in the southern portion of our district and is now looking for your feedback.

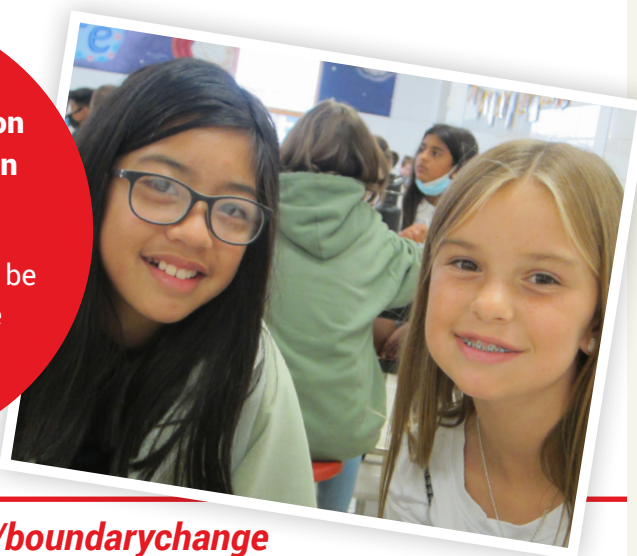

Why Change Boundaries?

- Elementary schools in the south - including Afton-Lakeland, Andersen, Brookview and Lake Elmo - are at or near capacity
- Lily Lake, Rutherford and Stonebridge are below capacity
- Oak-Land Middle School is also nearing its capacity
- Demographic studies are showing growth in Woodbury and Lake Elmo over the next several years that will further strain the capacity of southern buildings

Boundary changes will be implemented for the 2022-2023 school year



Guiding Principles for Boundary Changes:

- Decisions will be based on the best interests of all district students.
- A boundary plan will be created that positions us for our current needs and minimizes future changes.
- Feedback from various stakeholders will be gathered to provide insight (school board, administrative team, staff, and community group).
- Provide for a safe and efficient transportation system within board policy and procedures.
- Provide for the efficient utilization of district facilities to enhance learning opportunities for all students.
- Balance enrollment at existing elementary schools.
- Balance enrollment to middle school philosophy in both buildings.
- Alternate and open enrollments will be sent back to their designated attendance area to start the process at the elementary and middle school levels (exception: GATE, Amigos Unidos and Special Education site-based programs).
- To the extent possible, keep the feeder system to middle schools.
- To the extent possible, keep neighborhoods together (This does not mean that students will be sent to the school nearest their home, but rather that all students within a neighborhood be sent to the same school).

Initial Attendance Boundary Proposals

The following boundary change options are being considered by the school board. All numbers in the options listed below correspond to neighborhoods shown on the current map at right.

Option A

Move the southern part of 32B north from Lake Elmo to Brookview
 Move 29A, 29B and 30 (north of County Road 14) from Lake Elmo to Rutherford

Option B

Move the southern part of 32B north from Lake Elmo to Brookview
 Move 29A, 29B and 30 (north of County Road 14) from Lake Elmo to Rutherford
 Move 21 from Lily Lake to Stonebridge
 Move 24 from Andersen to Lily Lake
 Move 26A from Andersen to Lily Lake
 Move 27A from Afton-Lakeland to Andersen
 Move 28B from Lake Elmo to Andersen

Option C

Move the southern part of 32B north from Lake Elmo to Brookview
 Move 29A, 29B and 30 (north of County Road 14) from Lake Elmo to Rutherford
 Move 21 from Lily Lake to Stonebridge
 Move 16C from Rutherford to Lily Lake
 Move 17 from Rutherford to Lily Lake
 Move 18 from Rutherford to Lily Lake
