
First issue of Middle School DCI newspaper covers Haldane sports, book reviews, original comics, puzzles, and more.


Board of Education Recognizes 2022 National Merit Scholars



On Tuesday, October 19, 2021, the Haldane Board of Education recognized three Haldane Seniors for their scholastic achievements as Commended National Merit Scholars in the 2022 National Merit Scholarship Program. Congratulations to Matthew McCoy, Owen Carmicino, and Marcel Schwarz.

Over 1.5 million juniors entered the 2022 National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the 2020 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®). The nationwide pool of semifinalists, representing less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors, includes the highest-scoring entrants in each state.


Haldane Monster Magnificent Authors Now In Print
