- Create and oversee experiential and experimental extracurricular programming for Upper School students related to physics, engineering, and technology
- Blend classroom instruction with laboratory activities and independent research projects
- Advise a group of students

In addition to having a professional and educational background in teaching physics, we seek someone who will:

- Be an enthusiastic teacher and supportive guide for Upper School-aged students
- Stay current with best practices in teaching and the teaching of science, including incorporating technology and differentiating instruction

- Determine learning goals and design coherent instruction and assessments accordingly
- Have the mindset and ability to work in partnership with parents
- Understand and be committed to the School's Quaker values and mission
- Be an engaged member of the Friends' Central faculty and wider community

Qualifications:

- Experience working with Upper School-aged students
- Masters Degree or higher in physics and/or relevant experience preferred
- Proficiency with technology applications to enhance classroom learning
