North Point High School for Science, Technology & Industry is a public school located in Charles County, Maryland, and opened its doors on August 29, 2005. The current enrollment of **1820** students in grades nine through twelve is composed of county wide and zoned students. North Point is both a comprehensive high school and a science, technology and industry school, with great socioeconomic diversity, offering college preparatory, advanced placement, career, technology & education, business, general, and special education programs. A portion of our student population is comprised of CTE students, who are selected through a competitive application process, and the remaining students are those residing within our school zone. Its proximity to Baltimore, Virginia and Washington, D.C. provides numerous educational opportunities. Charles County is one of the most rapidly growing counties in the State of Maryland.

Academics

Charles County Public Schools and North Point High School work together to educate all students to enable them to reach their potential and to be productive citizens. Our goal is to prepare our students in the areas of academic achievement, career readiness and personal responsibility. Our programs and services are designed to meet the individual needs of all students and to create a unique learning opportunity.

Athletics

North Point Eagles compete in the Southern Maryland Athletic Conference (SMAC) in both men and women's sports. North Point offers a full range of athletic teams including freshman, junior varsity and varsity. Women compete in softball, basketball, golf, soccer, field hockey, lacrosse, tennis, volleyball, cheerleading, poms, indoor and outdoor track and field, cross country and swimming. Men compete in baseball, basketball, golf, soccer, lacrosse, football, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, cross country, wrestling and swimming.

Faculty and Administration

The faculty and administration include the principal, seven administrators, six school counselors, one CTE admissions officer, one college & career advisor, one athletic director, one instructional specialist, one media specialist, classroom teachers, instructional assistants, a school nurse and support staff. Other members include a pupil personnel worker, school psychologists, speech therapist and School Resource Officer, all of which are available to students as needed.

Co-Curricular Activities

Students may participate in a wide variety of activities including: Robotics Team, MESA, SkillsUSA, Band (Marching, Jazz and Symphonic), Orchestra, Choir (Show, Chamber, Mixed, Concert, and Eagles in Harmony), Theatre Arts, Yearbook, SADD, National Honor Society, Student Government, FEA, It's Academic, Newspaper Club, Math Team, Student2Student, Key Club, Spanish Club, French Club, FBLA, Envirothon, Fellowship of Christian Athletes and AFJROTC.
