

CCMR Indicators for HS, K-12, and Districts

College Testing Requirements

Colleges require students to demonstrate readiness through their SAT or ACT scores. Texas public colleges also accept the TSIA to demonstrate that students are "ready" for college-level coursework.

FAFSA & TASFA

What are the State requirements?



A New State Graduation Requirement: Starting with 2022 High School Graduates



State of Texas requires that high school seniors in the 2021-2022 school year (and each year after) complete and submit a FAFSA or TASFA application in order to graduate.

Students can opt out only if:

- A parent/guardian submits a signed form, OR
- Student is 18 years of age or older and submits a signed form, OR
- School counselor authorizes the students to decline to submit an application due to "good cause"

FAFSA or TASFA



Depending on your situation you will apply for financial aid in one of two ways:

- If you have a Social Security Number, you will fill out the FAFSA.
- If you do not have a Social Security Number, or have a Social Security Number through DACA, you will fill out TASFA.


Microcredentials (Grades 9-12 Only)



Micro-credentials are a tool for pre-qualification and a way to gauge longer-term interest and compatibility within a career path.



OnRamps vs. Dual Credit



OnRamps

OnRamps is our largest dual credit program. Students take a class offered face-to-face by NISD teachers and a UT professor (online).

Cost: \$149 per course or \$99 for students who qualify for free or reduced lunch.

Current enrollment: 1648

Dual Credit

Our traditional dual credit programs are growing. Currently we offer face-to-face dual credit options at Steele through the Early College High School and the Collegiate Academy. Byron Nelson and Eaton high schools also offer a face-to-face dual credit math option. All other dual credit is online.


