Nike Re-Use A Shoe Recycling Program

The Nike Re-Use A Shoe Program collects athletic shoes and they are then ground down and re-used as playground resurfacing material in disadvantaged neighborhood throughout the country. Collection Boxes should be placed in your school's vestibule area for easy drop off by Parents, Students and Staff members. The collection boxes can be either a hand painted/decorated box or plastic bin with a sign designating it as your drop box. The Collection Box needs to be monitored by either The Unit Environmental Chair or

other designated volunteer(s). The Box must also be keep neat and tidy and should never be overflowing with donated shoes. Any brand of athletic/tennis shoe, in Any condition may be collected EXCEPT those shoes containing Metal Grommets or Eyelets. Your school will be supplied packing boxes for your collected shoes. The shoes are to be counted (as pairs), placed in the packing boxes with the total visible on the outside of the box and with no more than 100 pair per box. Additionally, the flaps of the packing boxes must close completely, without bulging for shipping purposes.

The Mt. Lebanon Schools are once again collecting old and tattered tennis shoes for the Nike Re-Use A Shoe Program. This program collects worn out sneakers that are then ground down into playground resurfacing material for underprivileged neighborhoods across the country. Last school year, during the month of April, our schools collected over 850 pairs of sneakers for this program....yes, that's right, 850 pairs!!! So look under your beds and check your closets for old shoes that no longer fit or are just too gross to wear anymore.

We can collect any kind of tennis shoe. However, if they have metal grommets (ex. Converse), please cut out the grommets before you turn them in.

Bring your old shoes to school starting April 2. You can drop them off until April 26 and they will then be taken down to the Earth Day Celebration at Mt. Lebanon Main Park. (If you forget to drop off your shoes, feel free to come to Earth Day to drop them off and enjoy the day).

Electronic Equipment Recycling

ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT RECYCLING DROP-OFF

The Mt. Lebanon Commission enacted an ordinance prohibiting certain electronic devices from the curbside trash stream. The ordinance is based on Pennsylvania's Covered Device Recycling Act. Covered devices are defined as "covered computer and television devices marketed and intended for use by consumers." This includes keyboards, printers and any other device that connects to a computer or television. Although not specifically included in the state law, the ordinance Mt. Lebanon has enacted to comply with the act extends to include cell phones.

Effective September 1, 2011 residents may no longer put televisions, computers, printers and various other electronic devices out with the regular trash. Recycling electronic items keeps them out of the landfill and decreases the amount of heavy metals that leach into the ground. In cooperation with the Mt. Lebanon Public Works Department, the contractor (www.jvsenvironmental.com) offers an electronic items disposal service to the residents and businesses of Mt. Lebanon. Most electronic devices will be recycled free of charge. Any covered devices left out for trash or recycling pickup will be tagged unsuitable for pickup by Waste Management, Mt. Lebanon's trash contractor, and must be removed from the curb.

Residents can bring items to the Public Works yard, 1250 Lindendale Drive (off Cedar Bivd) on the following Saturdays listed below between 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.:

Washington Elementary has been participating in the Terracycle Recycling Program for the past few years. Over the years, and using various brigades, we have added over \$1000 for our PTA treasury.

Terracycle often limits the number of participants in a particular brigade (for example, only 1000 slots are available to collect writing instruments). In the past, I've heard of schools in our district that wanted to collect items (pens, glue sticks, etc.), but found the brigades to be closed. HOWEVER, that does not mean that other schools in our district can not COLLECT the items and still get the MONEY for them.

Washington Elementary is set up to collect the following items:

- Cellular Phones
- Drink Pouches
- Scotch Tape Rings/plastic dispensers
- · Glue bottles and sticks
- Dead writing instruments (pens, markers, sharpies, dry erase, mechanical pencils)
- Laptops/E-Readers/Tablets
- Miscellaneous E-Waste (GPS, digital cameras, digital video cameras, graphing calculators)
- GoGo Squeeze pouches
- Energy Bar Wrappers (all kinds of granola bar wrappers with foil insides)

If you would like to set up a station to collect these items at your school, I can send you a label through the Washington Elementary account and set you up as one of our "designated charities." The funds from anything you collect would be sent to your PTA.

To register your PTA to receive funds from Terracycle, I need to set your PTA up as one of my "charities." I need the following information:

- School
- · School Address
- School Phone Number
- Contact (can be PTA President or Environmental Chair)
- Contact email address
- PTA Federal Tax ID Number

After that is done, you can go ahead and collect! Visit http://s3.amazonaws.com/tc-us-prod/download_resource/downloads/498/Collection_Programs_Cheat_Sheet.pdf to see more information about shipping minimums. When you are ready to send a shipment, send me an email and let me know what you have collected- I'll email you a shipping label (it's free) and you can take your box to the nearest UPS dropoff site for shipment. When the shipment is received and tallied, I'll add the amount you should be credited to my spreadsheet. My "charitable donations" need to be made in increments of \$10, so when your PTA has hit that amount, I'll credit your account.

Terracycle sends checks twice a year, so it will accumulate.



How TerraCycle Works

TerraCycle points can be redeemed for a variety of charitable gifts, or for a payment of \$0.01 per point to the non-profit organization or school of your choice.


