College Prep

For students entering grades 10–12.

Online courses are also available for math credit.

For students entering grades 7–12. Online option available.

If you're an international student and want to improve your English skills in order to enroll at an American high school or university, this is the program for you. There are classes for all levels, from beginners to advanced speakers. Students will be placed in the appropriate level through an English-language placement test.

Our experienced ESOL teachers will provide personal attention in small classes and a supportive environment and individual attention. You'll read novels, write essays, give oral presentations in English, do research on American culture, and interact with students from all over the world.
