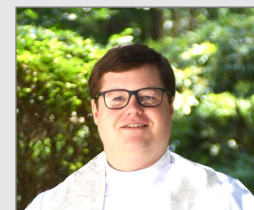

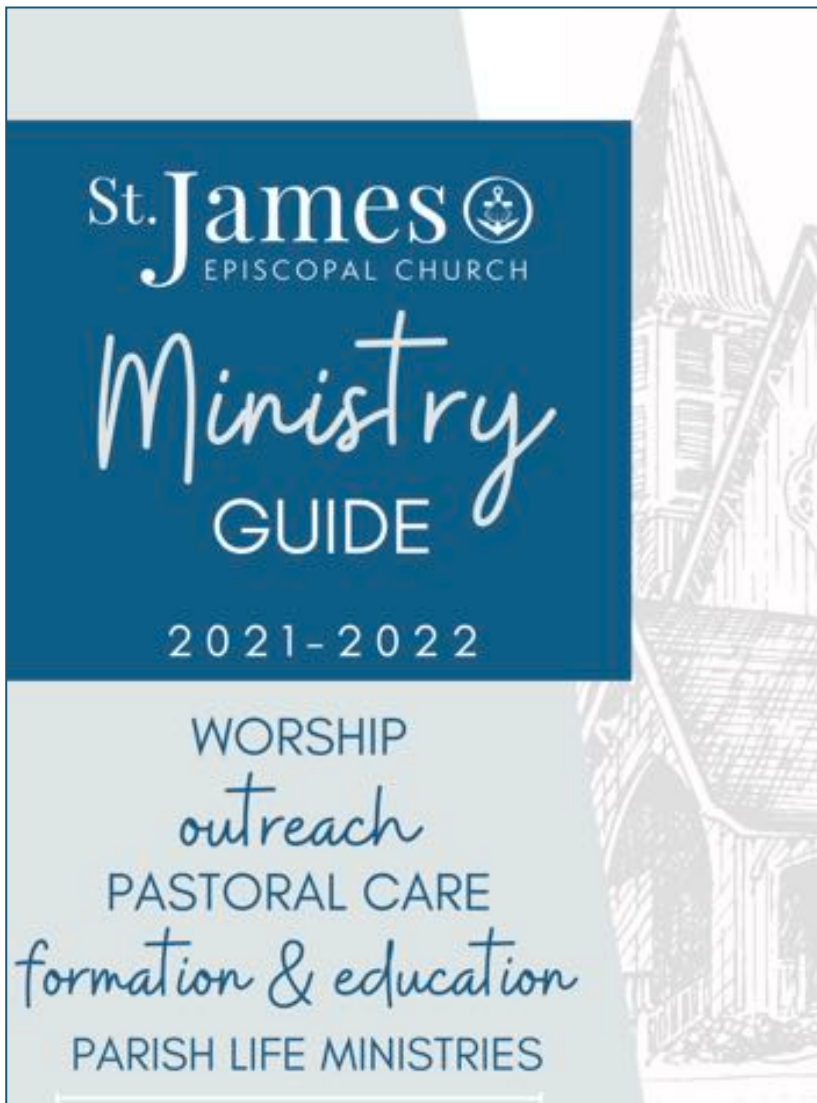

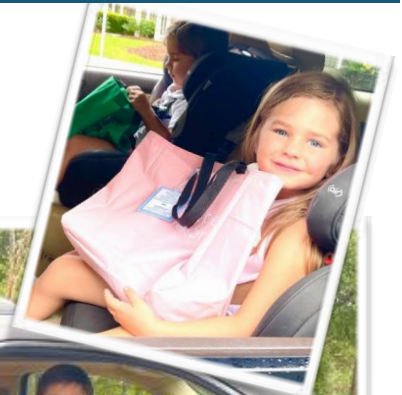

What is Compline?

In short, Compline is a sung prayer service. Compline consist of psalms, short passages from scripture, an office hymn, canticle, litany, collects and additional prayers. The offering of prayer in the evening, by laity or clergy, has sometimes been described as the "goodnight prayer of the church." It rounds off the day and prepares us for a quiet night. Compline is offered when the work of the day is completed, and the quietness of evening settles over the hearts and minds of those who have come together in thankfulness for the blessings of the day, and in anticipation of God's gift of a new day.

Five months after Paris liberated, Duruflé's father died. This gave impulse to the completion of his greatest work, the Requiem, published in 1948 and dedicated to the memory of his father. Composed entirely on Gregorian themes, all nine movements are based on the mass and defects, evoking memories of the disciplines learned by the choirboys. In this intense work, the St. James Choir will be accompanied by Duruflé's intricate organ score, cello, and trumpet.

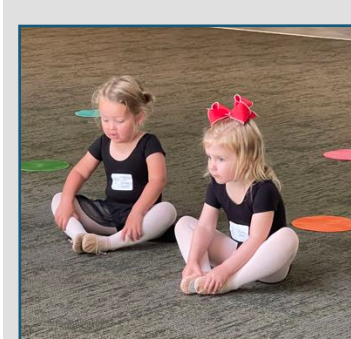
October 4 at 10:00 AM. Please remember masks are required.

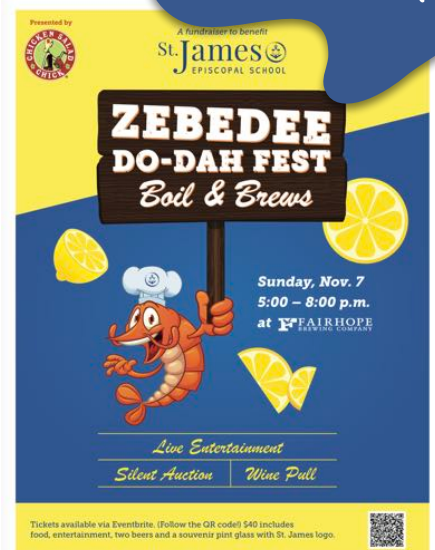

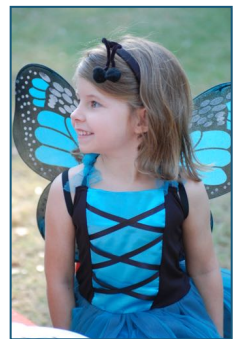

From our Bishop



The Episcopal Diocese of the Central Gulf Coast

Dear clergy, wardens, and lay leaders of churches without clergy,

One of the underlying intentions of The Book of Common Prayer is the sanctification of time. This is manifested in the many collects in the prayerbook that hallow the events and moments of life. One of my favorites is the collect for the time we just celebrated: Labor Day.

“Almighty God, you have so linked our lives one with another that all we do affects, for good or ill, all other lives: So guide us in the work we do, that we may do it not for self alone, but for the common good; and, as we seek a proper return for our own labor, make us mindful of the rightful aspirations of other workers, and arouse our concern for those who are out of work; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen”

Collect for Labor Day, the Book of Common Prayer, p. 261

“You have so linked our lives one with another that all we do affects, for good or ill, all other lives.”

I hold up that particular sentence for all of us, as we continue to make our way through this pandemic. What we do affects, for good or ill, all other lives. What a powerful reminder to those of us who follow Jesus. That we seek to live not just for self alone, but for the well-being of each other.

I hold this up as a word of encouragement for those of us who are worn out by it all. I hold it up as an appeal for charity for those who are frustrated about wearing masks. I hold it up as a balm for those who are tired of wearing masks, but will continue to do so, for the sake of our neighbor and the common good of our communities.

While there are some encouraging statistical trends in parts of our diocese, the number of hospitalizations due to COVID-19 infections is still at a critical level. As far as I can tell, this is true for every hospital in south Alabama and northwest Florida. When that news is added to the ongoing potential of breakthrough cases to those already vaccinated, the need for all to wear masks continues. Masks matter. Masks matter not just for self alone. Masks matter for the common good. So **let’s continue to ask our people to wear masks** when gathered in groups in our churches for a few more weeks. Let’s do so **until September 20, 2021.**
