



Clue was one of my favorite board games as a kid. As a teenager, it was my favorite comedy. I knew all of the lines by heart. My friends and I would re-enact it with Rocky Horror-esque fervor frequently. And we dreamed of a day, when we could make it a play for us to perform. So, 37 years later, my teenage dreams have officially come true.

Clue is a silly play based on a silly movie based on a board game. There are clues supporting its "real" ending (there are 7 in this play). However, you aren't expected to sleuth your way to a solution. Instead, the hope is you laugh your way there.

I am so proud of the students who have worked on this production. There is a saying that "Tragedy is easy. Comedy is hard." It is so true. For comedy to work, it requires precision, focus, and extreme talent. I can honestly say that each and every young person I have worked with on this show has brought all three to their work. I am so proud of them. They make me laugh and hold me in awe. Tonight, I am so grateful that you have come to witness this wonderful ensemble of young artists in our community.
