The Office of Admissions is excited to announce our Application for 2022-23 School Year is now open. In June 2021, Sister Rosemary launched our Admissions Season from our front steps here at W. Once you apply, you will be asked to submit your 6th and 7th Final Report Cards, any standardized test scores and a 7th Grade Teacher Recommendation.

If an applicant applies to Mercy Tech, includes your student's name on their application, and ends up attending Mercy Tech, you will receive a \$250 tuition credit. Applicants CAN NOT be a relative. You may obtain a maximum of 4 referrals.

Mercy East Renovation



Mercy Tech has returned to in-person learning with COVID-19 safety protocols. In order to have enough room to keep students socially distanced, Mercy Tech renovated five classrooms on the third floor of Mercy East, allowing the freshman class a space for academics.

This project had help from our current building trade students. They helped with clean out, some demolition, and the students ran electrical for new lights and ceiling fans. Mercy Tech also had free help from the Finishing Trades Institute. Painter apprentices used these classrooms to learn the art of painting.

Kudos to Matt Trzaska, Mercy Tech class of 1990, for connecting FTI with Mercy Tech to make this happen.

James J. Clearkin, Inc. served as the general contractor for the entire project. They performed or oversaw all the work on the project including carpentry, ceiling restoration, floor refinishing, electrical, painting, etc., and fully appreciated the help they got from our students and faculty on the demo and electrical work, not to mention the apprentice painters.

BUILDING TRADES




Building Trades is one of our most popular shops here at Mercy Tech.

URBAN GARDENING AT MERCY TECH!



The garden is growing at Mercy Tech thanks to the hard work of the Environmental Club and a \$1,000 grant from the Catholic Climate Covenant.

Environmental Club members held a virtual prayer service for Earth Day on April 22nd. Club members, with help from Building Trades students, dismantled the old greenhouse on the southwest corner of the main building. Of the five planting beds built, four beds were created from pieces of the old greenhouse.

Students raised bean plants from seedlings in the science lab and planted them in the outdoor beds along with a variety of young vegetable plants. These activities were integrated into the biology curriculum.

A late summer harvest from the gardens produced vegetables and wildflowers that were used in the Culinary & Pastry Arts program and taken home by faculty and staff.

"Our students worked hard and continue to be committed to gardening activities that preserve our local environment," said Amanda Muir, Science teacher and Environmental Club moderator. "And we are grateful to the Catholic Climate Covenant whose generous support made this possible."
