• All of the schools are looking great and ready to welcome students back.

- Parents will only have one certification this year, not daily.
- Additional funding ESSER grants which Mary Robinson will be working with Rich Searl using Rich and Mary to create virtual tutoring for struggling students.

Dr. Ruland Reported:

- New ELA/Math Curriculum trainings were offered during the summer.
- Instructional coaches are starting to work together. All trainings will be paid out of Title II
- ELL Program Erika Martinez is doing a fantastic job. Tiffany will be overseeing the ELL Program.

Rich Searl Reported:

• Things are looking good in all buildings.

Mary Robinson Reported:

• Emailed all parents regarding lunches remaining free for the entire school year and we will receive reimbursement from the federal government.

Sarah Massey Reported:

• We are experiencing a teacher shortage and in December will be attending a job fair.

5.02 Enrollment, Staffing Update

Dr. Monn reported enrollments as of today we have over 4500 students. We are trying to keep our kindergarten and lower grades with a smaller class size.

Dr, Monn reported that we hired 45 new teachers. Thanked Lori Shanholtzer and the business office for all of the work in getting all of the new hires processed. Transportation is comfortable with the staffing they have. Aux Sable 1st Grade and Kindergarten are higher than anticipated but keep as is for now. Jones 2nd grade is a little higher than anticipated
