

I've taken over this week's principal message to bring you this special counselor message! My name is Kristin Bauer and I am the school counselor at Rockwell Elementary. I am so happy to be part of this incredible community. I love my job and feel lucky to do what I do. As a mom of 9-year-old twins, I know that helping your child navigate the social and emotional rollercoaster of life can be hard and often overwhelming, especially with all that is happening in our world right now. As a school counselor, I work with students, families and staff to support students in achieving their academic, personal and social goals. My mission is to ensure that each child has equal access and opportunity to achieve success. My job is to support ALL students, not just those with an emotional disability or in a crisis. I work with kids through counselor lessons, in small groups, and individually. While we are in remote learning, I will be providing by synchronous and asynchronous counselor lessons. Coming up this month K-2nd grades will receive lessons on problem solving using Kelso's Choices and 3rd-5th grades will listen to a book series that brings awareness to bullying. Additionally, in honor of October Disability Awareness Month, all students will listen to a book about disability awareness and have the opportunity to reflect on how they can be a friend to all.

## LWSD Updates

#### **COVID Student Quarantine Update**

As we near the end of the first month of school we want to thank all of our students, families, and staff for the collective efforts to keep everyone safe. We continue to need everyone to be vigilant about staying home when sick, wearing face coverings, and washing hands.

We continue to follow guidance from King County Public Health, recently updated, when it comes to determining when students can return to school when they are close contacts, test positive, or have symptoms. Isolating and quarantining students or staff that present symptoms, test positive, or have been close contacts is an important layer of safety to help prevent transmission of COVID-19 within our schools.

When provided with a range of options we are using the safest options identified by King County Public Health. We will continue to evaluate the impact on our students and schools and may adopt other options identified by Public Health as conditions evolve. Under Public Health guidance:

 Unvaccinated students and staff identified as close contacts and have a negative test will quarantine for 14 days from the last date of contact with the person with COVID-19.

- Students and staff who are vaccinated and do not have symptoms do not need to quarantine
- Students and staff who test positive and have no symptoms can return after isolating for 10 days. If students and staff who test positive and do have symptoms must also be symptom free before returning.
- Students and staff with symptoms of illness, who test negative and have no close contact, can return 24 hours after symptoms have passed OR if there is an alternative diagnosis by a health care provider
- Students and staff with symptoms, who test positive, and have no close contact are required to isolate for **10 days**.

In all Families can access testing in multiple ways, including

- Accessing free testing sites and private providers as a first option for testing
- For families that cannot access free sites or private providers resources, the district will soon begin offering free testing at regional sites.
- More information about our COVID Safety Plan is available here cases where students
  have symptoms, they must be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning
  regardless of the length of isolation or quarantine.

### Highly Capable Universal Screening Update for 1st Grade

In order to decrease the number of assessments students are given, LWSD first grade students in LWSD will be universally screened using FastBridge for reading and math. Students that meet the screening criteria (85th percentile NPR in each area) will be invited to continue in the highly capable eligibility process. The CoGAT screener will not be administered during the 2021-22 school year.

### **Too Sick for School**

One of the best ways to avoid community transmission of COVID-19, and other infectious illness, is to stay home when you are sick. Students and school employees who have symptoms of infectious illness, such as influeza (flu) or COVID-19 should stay home and seek medical evaluation, which may include testing for COVID-19 and other respiratory infections.

While the school will no longer require an attestation form at the start of each day, we ask

families to please answer the following questions at home before deciding to send your child to school. If you answer "YES" to any of the following questions, keep your student home and contact your school.

- 1. Has your student been in close contact with anyone with confirmed COVID-19?
- 2. Does anyone in your household have COVID-19 like symptoms and/or is anyone in your household being tested for COVID-19?
- 3. Has your student or anyone in your household had a positive COVID-19 test for active virus in the past 10 days?
- 4. Within the past 14 days, has a public health or medical professional told your student to self-monitor, self-isolate or self-quarantine because of concerns about COVID-19?











### Snapshots of Rockwell Learning


### Plans for Halloween, 2021

### Fall State Testing Starts Soon for our 4th and 5th Graders

Each spring, all Washington public school students in grades 3-8 and 10 are assessed in English Language Arts (ELA) and math using Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA). Students in grades 5, 8 and 11 are also assessed in science using the Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science (WCAS). Results from these assessments provide meaningful feedback and data that teachers and other educators can use to help students succeed. The results provide data to help evaluate school-level and district-wide instructional strategies, initiatives, and other programs.

Last spring, these tests were postponed until the fall by the Washington Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI). This was due to the number of students attending school remotely. The fall tests will be based on the content from the previous grade level and have also been shortened in length. For example, 4th grade students will be taking a shorter 3rd grade test.


Our current 4th and 5th grade students at Rockwell will be taking the fall test on October 19th and 20th. Learn more about the state assessments on the district website. Next spring, we will be back to the regular schedule of state testing for grades 3, 4 and 5.


We are looking at these assessments as a data point to help us plan instruction. If you child is K-3 remind them to be extra quiet in the hallways on the morning of the 19th and 20th. If your child is in 4th or 5th grade, ensure they get a good night's sleep and breakfast the morning of testing. We are excited for our students to share what they have learned.
