I greatly value the opportunities I get to leave my desk and tour the school capturing learning in action. The atmosphere in school is really positive and I'm incredibly proud of the work taking place here.

Trailblazers have been getting out and about, exploring the history of Lindfield during wartime, including visiting the war memorial in the village, and have been to Newhaven Fort to deepen their understanding of war and peace.
