## Prioritizing Student Success in All Areas!

The 2021-2022 school year is under way and we are thrilled to have the majority of our students back on campus.

Students who prefer the remote learning model versus traditional classes are enrolled in Explorer Academy, our online K-12 option. Instructional staff district-wide are focused on meeting students where they are academically and ensuring their success moving forward.

While most students navigated remote learning with ease last year, others faced challenges. In response, the South Kitsap Summer Academy offered learning support and credit recovery for many students. The program was tremendously successful, with more than 800 students and 100 staff involved.

The physical health and safety of our students and staff is our top priority. We have COVID health protocols in place to keep our school community as safe as possible. Per Governor Inslee's mandate, masks continue to be required for all while indoors and on school buses. COVID vaccinations are required by the State for all public school employees. More details about our response to COVID including cleaning and campus modifications are on the District website. Emotional health is also a focus area as we serve students this year. South Kitsap staff are utilizing a wellness toolbox to understand how students are coping with life during a pandemic. Every student is facing a different set of challenges and support must include emotional as well as academic resources.

Valuable lessons were learned during remote learning and we will remain nimble as we face the highs and lows during this school year. Our goal is to keep students on campus as much as possible. We are committed to make this year the best it can possibly be for South Kitsap students.

## Diversity, Equity, & Inclusionary Practices

South Kitsap School District is committed to increasing awareness, understanding and effective practices related to equity, inclusion, diversity and cultural competency through professional learning for all staff. This system-wide approach is directed by Senate Bill 5044 (ESSB 5044) and also woven throughout the District's Top 5 Priority Plan.

Beginning in the 2020-21school year, school districts must use one of the professional learning days to train staff in one or more of the following topics: social-emotional learning, trauma-informed practices, recognition and response to emotional or behavioral distress, consideration of adverse childhood experiences, mental health literacy, anti-bullying strategies, or culturally sustaining practices.

South Kitsap staff started this school year with district wide Equity Training led by Bernardo Ruiz from Racing 2 Equity. Staff engaged in courageous conversations about educational justice and racial equity. They worked to gain a common understanding of how critical this work is to student and staff success. This focus will continue in coming years. In the 2023-2024 school year, districts must provide staff training and professional learning aligned with the Washington Professional Educator standards of practice. This includes cultural competency, equity, diversity, inclusion, multicultural education and principles of English language acquisition.

### Defining Terms

### Diversity -

The presence of similarities and differences within a given setting, collective, or group based on multiple factors including race and ethnicity, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability status, age, educational status, religion, geography, primary language, culture, and other characteristics and experiences.

## Equity -

Developing, strengthening, and supporting procedural and outcome fairness in systems, procedures, and resource distribution mechanisms to create equitable opportunities for all individuals. The term also includes eliminating barriers that prevent the full participation of individuals and groups.

### Inclusion -

Intentional efforts and consistent sets of actions to create and sustain a sense of respect, belonging, safety and attention to individual needs and backgrounds that ensure the full access to engagement and participation in available activities and opportunities.

## Cultural Competency -

Knowledge of student cultural histories and contexts, as well as family norms and values in different cultures; knowledge and skills in accessing community resources and community and parent outreach; and skills in adapting instruction to students' experiences and identifying cultural contexts for individual students.

## What About CRT?

South Kitsap School District does not have Critical Race Theory curriculum. Nothing in our curriculum prescribes or mentions Critical Race Theory. Furthermore, ESSB 5044 does not mention Critical Race Theory nor instruction or curriculum.
