Responsibilities:

- Teach courses in our math program. The offerings currently range from Algebra I to Multivariable Calculus (Advanced). We are looking for as much flexibility as possible.
- Collaborate with colleagues to incorporate coding into each math course
- Lead an extracurricular activity or club based on experience and interest – this may or may not be math related
- Be prepared to work with students outside of class for support and enrichment
- Advise a group of students

In addition to having a professional and educational background in teaching math, we seek someone who will:

- Be an enthusiastic teacher and supportive guide for Upper School-aged students
- Stay current with best practices in teaching and the teaching of math, including incorporating technology and differentiating instruction

- Determine learning goals and design coherent instruction and assessments accordingly
- Have the mindset and ability to work in partnership with colleagues and parents
- Understand and be committed to the School's Quaker values and mission
- Be an engaged member of the Friends' Central faculty and wider community

Qualifications:

- Experience working with Upper School-aged students
- A BS in mathematics or a related field. An advanced degree is preferred
- Proficiency with technology applications to enhance classroom learning
