

A Letter from our Seminarian, Kenneth White-Spunner

January 31, 2020

Dear St. James Family,

It was so wonderful to see many of you over the Christmas break! It was a blur and I regret that I didn't have an opportunity to visit with each of you individually. As you may remember from my last letter, seminary is an incredible place. It's not only a place that challenges you intellectually, but it strips away those things I won't need and adds things I will. They call this process formation and it's sometimes uncomfortable, ha ha! But I can feel myself growing and that makes my heart sing. I count it as a win that I got A's and B's last semester!

This semester I'm taking the following courses: January Encuentro, Pastoral Theology I: Foundation of Pastoral Ministry, Junior Colloquy, Liturgy I, Biblical Studies: History and Hermeneutics II,

& History of Christianity II. All promise to be challenging and rewarding.

January Encuentro is a semester course that's wedged in the month of January so it's very intensive. We spent a weekend in Laredo on the border and immersed ourselves in daily coursework and learning from a Spanish-speaking Episcopal church in the area. The issues we are facing at the border are far more horrifying and disturbing than any of us have been exposed to in the news. And the most horrifying things have been happening for decades and are part of policy for both Republican and Democratic administrations. I was truly shocked at some of the things I learned, particularly a long-standing policy called "Prevention Through Deterrence."

I take great comfort reading Anchor Lines and getting updates on the great work my St. James family is

undertaking to make our world a little better.


