The front-page article in today's Island Packet is very encouraging yet disturbing. On one hand, Dr. Berg has acknowledged that "there is an achievement gap problem, and the educators in this system know it," said interim superintendent Herb Berg, who took over for Jeff Moss in August. "And I expect (chief instructional officer) Bonnie (Almond) and the other principals and educational leaders to analyze the problem and figure out a solution that will help and start moving toward addressing the problem." Dr. Berg is the first Superintendent ever to acknowledge that there is a problem. That is encouraging.

However, what we find disturbing is the response from our Chief Instructional Officer. When asked what has prevented the district from closing the gap over the past three years, Almond, the district's chief instructional officer, said it was because of a lack of uniform expectations from the state. So, we're blaming the state for not holding the district accountable? Really?

"I think we've come through a time where there was no accountability measures," Almond said. "We've gone through a time when testing has changed a lot so we didn't have the utopia expectation of where we should all be."

Utopia----"an imagined place or state of things in which everything is perfect." No one is expecting "perfect" but we do NOT think that we have to RELY on the state to tell the Beaufort County School District that it needs to do better; in particular in closing the achievement gap.

We do hope that the voters will choose to elect responsible board members next month who understand that they are in charge. We can do better.
