



## DIVINE CHILD RELIC OF THE WEEK



St. Cecilia: Feast Day November 22 Patron of Musicians

Divine Child has 43 Relics in our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel and St. Cecilia is of them! You may view a list of DC's relics located on the bookshelf in the Adoration Chapel.

St. Cecilia came from an extremely rich family and was given in marriage to a youth named Valerian. She told her husband she had taken a vow of virginity and had an angel protecting her. After Valerian was baptized, he was able to see the angel at her side. Valerian was executed after he refused to offer a sacrifice to the gods. St. Cecilia spent her time preaching and was able to convert over four-hundred people, most of whom were baptized by Pope Urban. She was later arrested and condemned to be suffocated in the baths. She was shut in for one night and one day, as fires were heaped up and stoked to a terrifying heat - but Cecilia did not even sweat. When Almachius heard this, he sent an executioner to cut off her head in the baths.

The executioner struck her three times but was unable to decapitate her so he left her bleeding and she lived for three days. Crowds came to her and collected her blood while she preached to them or prayed. On the third day she died and was buried by Pope Urban and his deacons.

St. Cecilia is regarded as the patroness of music, because she heard heavenly music in her heart when she was married, and is represented in art with an organ or organ pipes in her hand.

Officials exhumed her body in 1599 and found her to be incorrupt, the first of all incorrupt saints. She was draped in a silk veil and wore a gold embroidered dress. They also reported a "mysterious and delightful flower-like odor which proceeded from the coffin."

## Happy Holidays from St. Vincent de Paul

As we enter this wonderful holiday time of Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas, I wish to thank you all for your support of St. Vincent de Paul throughout this past year. Without you, we would not be able to help our Neighbors in Need and keep the SVdP food pantry well-stocked at St. Maria Goretti (formerly St. Sebastian), which serves the families in our area. Thank you also for your generous support of our clothing drive last weekend!

This past month, our SVdP conference has helped 8 families with rent, provided 21 homeless individuals or families with a motel stay to shower and get warm, gave 14 families Kroger cards for food, 11 new families began using the food pantry, 7 families were given gas cards so they could get to work, 2 families were given clothing and we purchased a used stove and refrigerator for one household. Total help given in October was \$7,549.

This week, together with the Sacred Heart Christian Service Committee, we will be providing food for Thanksgiving meals to 20 families in the DC and SH parish areas.

Thank you again for your continued generous support of our SVdP conference. Donations can be made through the Poor Box on the back wall of Divine Child Church, or the SVdP boxes at the entrances of Sacred Heart Church. May God bless you richly for your generous hearts in supporting those in need.

Please call the Rectory Office to request this Sacrament. In emergency situations when the office is closed, the emergency line attendant will take the call.

## **Baptisms**

Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a **Baptism class** prior to the Baptism. The Church requires that at least one of the parents and one of the godparents/sponsors be practicing Catholics; that is, they attend Mass each weekend.

## Marriages

One person of the couple must be an active, registered parishioner of Divine Child for at least 6 months. (Exceptions are made for DC alumni.) The Church requires a minimum of 6 months for marriage preparation. Potential wedding date is not confirmed until couple meets with a Divine Child priest. The celebrant will be a Divine Child priest unless the couple has someone close to them who is a Catholic priest. Music for the liturgy must be coordinated with our Director of Music Ministry, Mr. Matthew Simpson.

Arrangements are made in conjunction with the funeral home. Eulogies must be given at the funeral home or at the funeral luncheon; no eulogies at the funeral Mass, please. Memorial Masses are scheduled Monday-Friday only.
