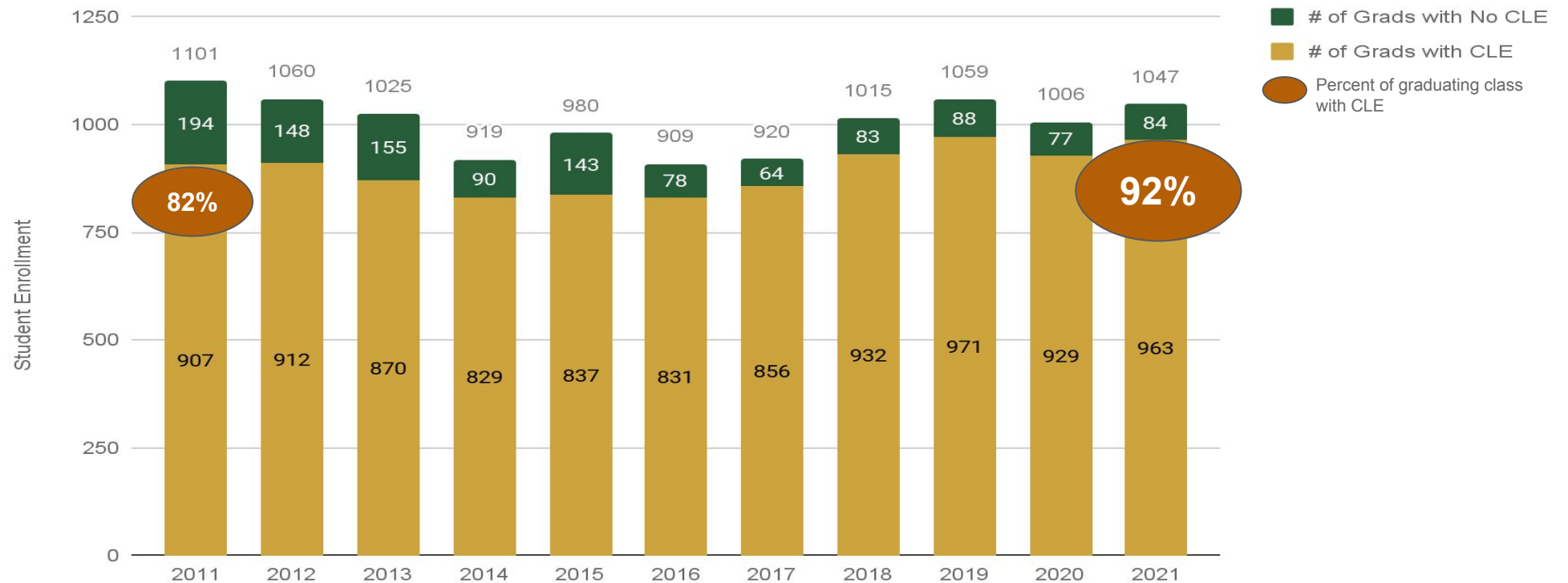

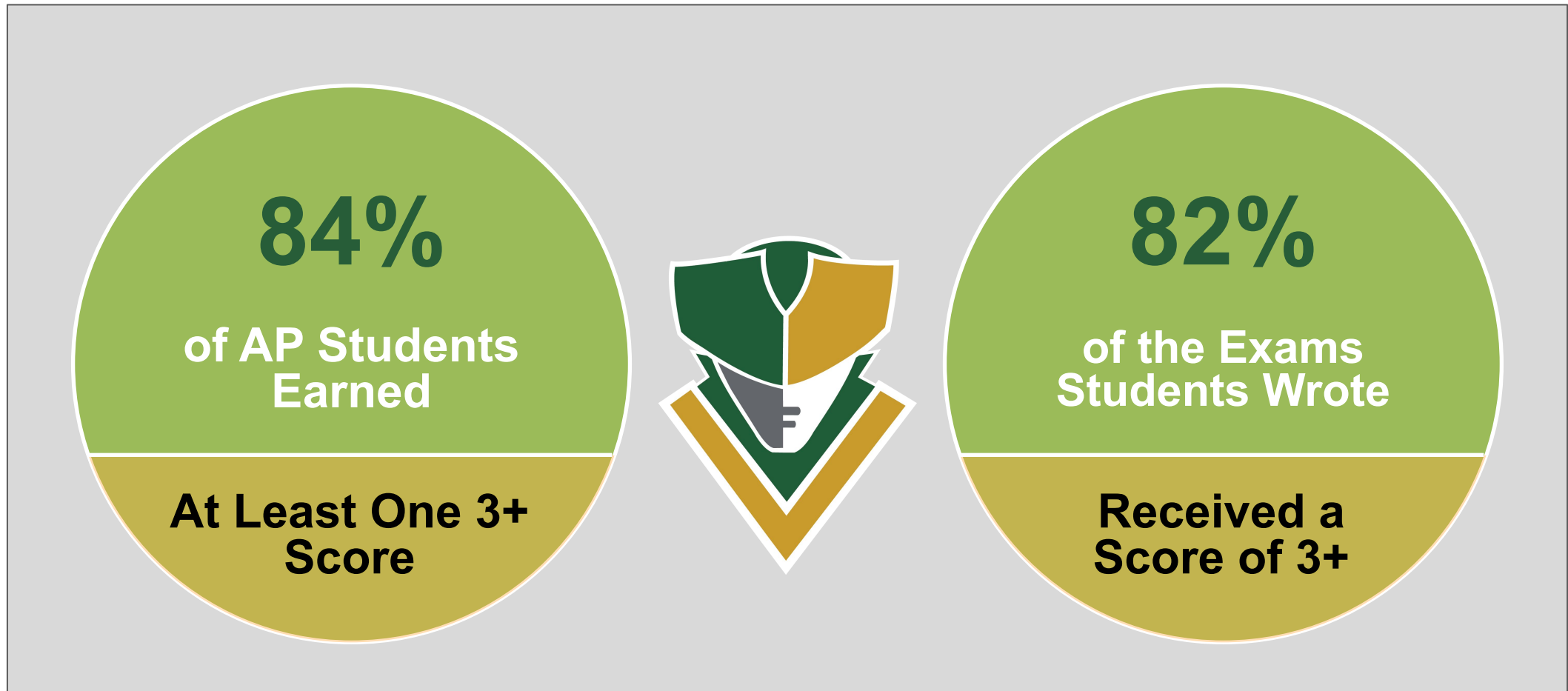

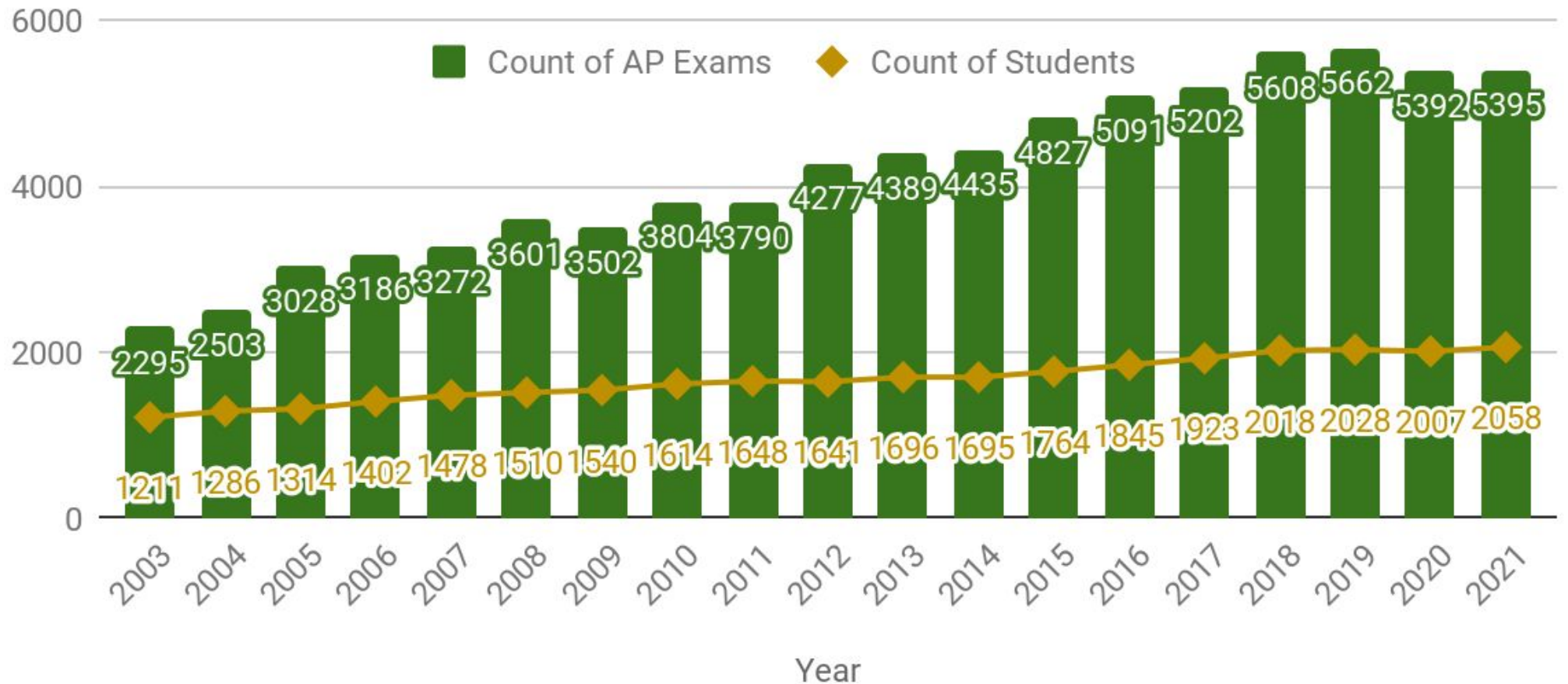

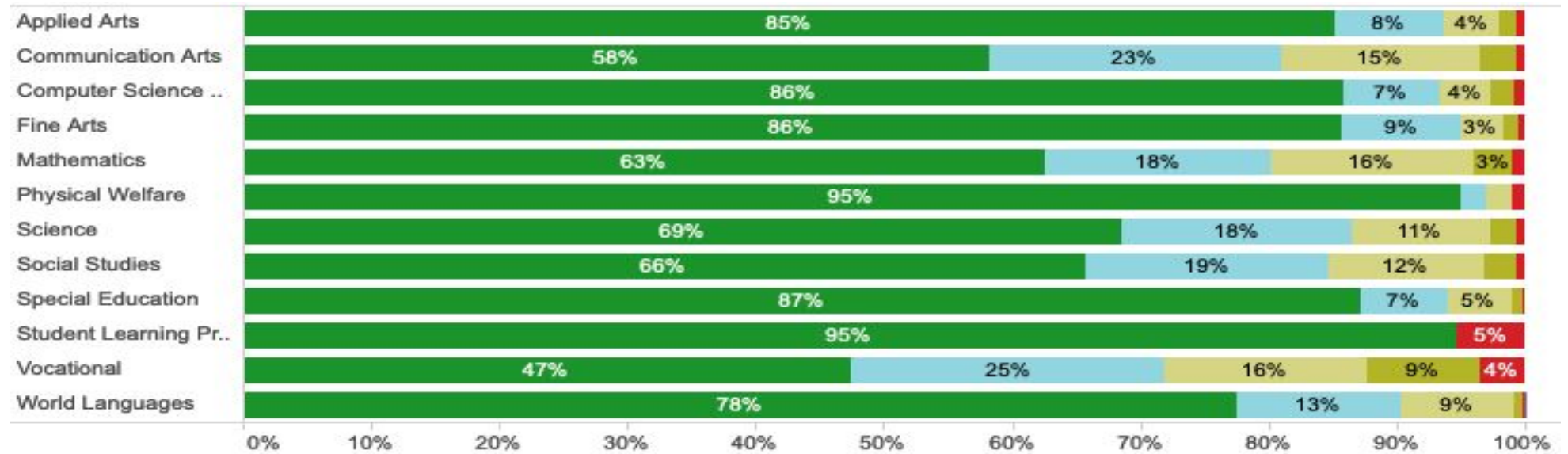
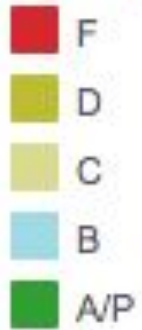

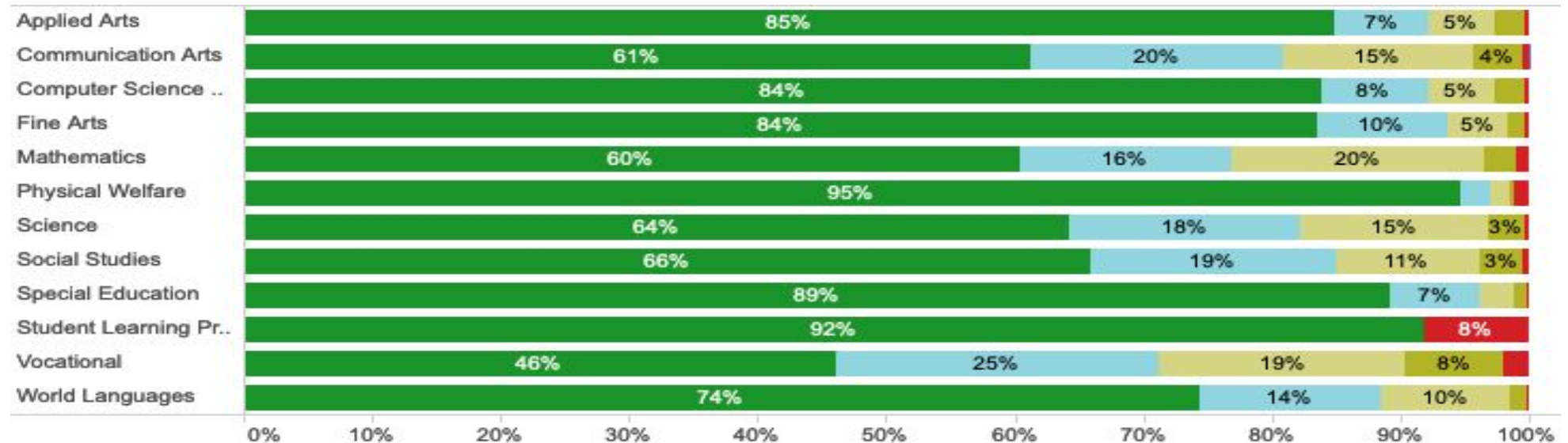



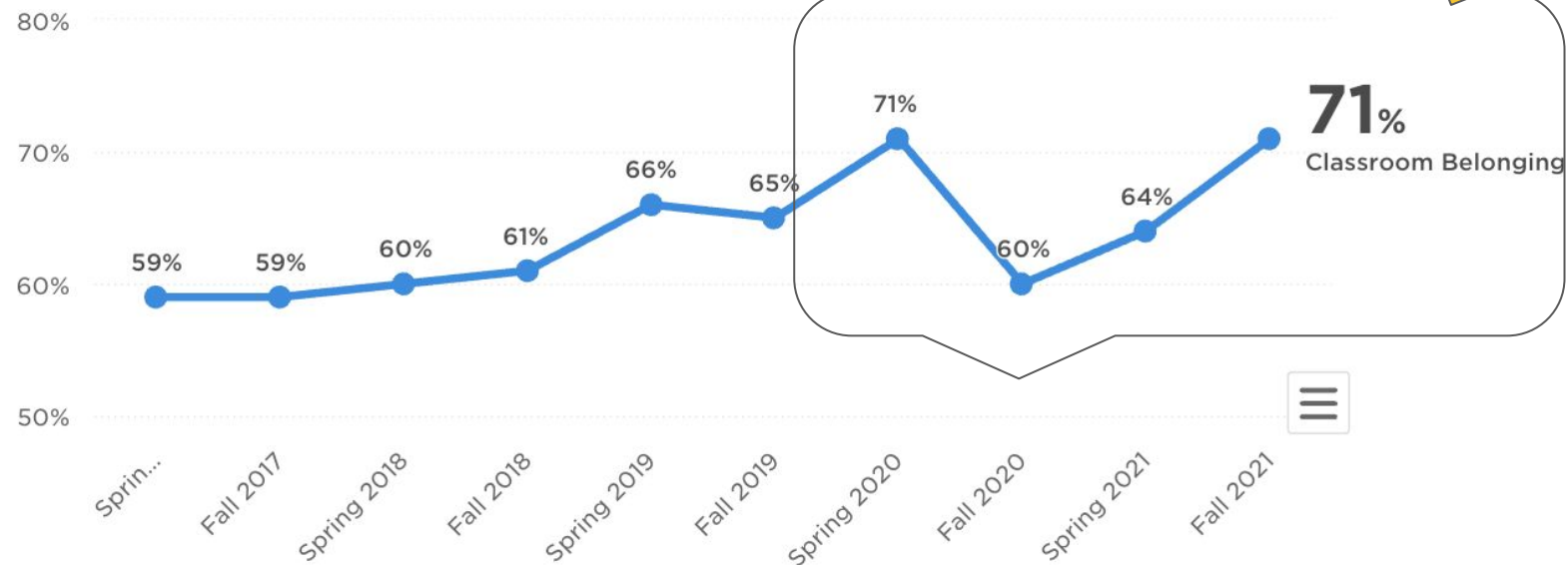

How have results changed over time?

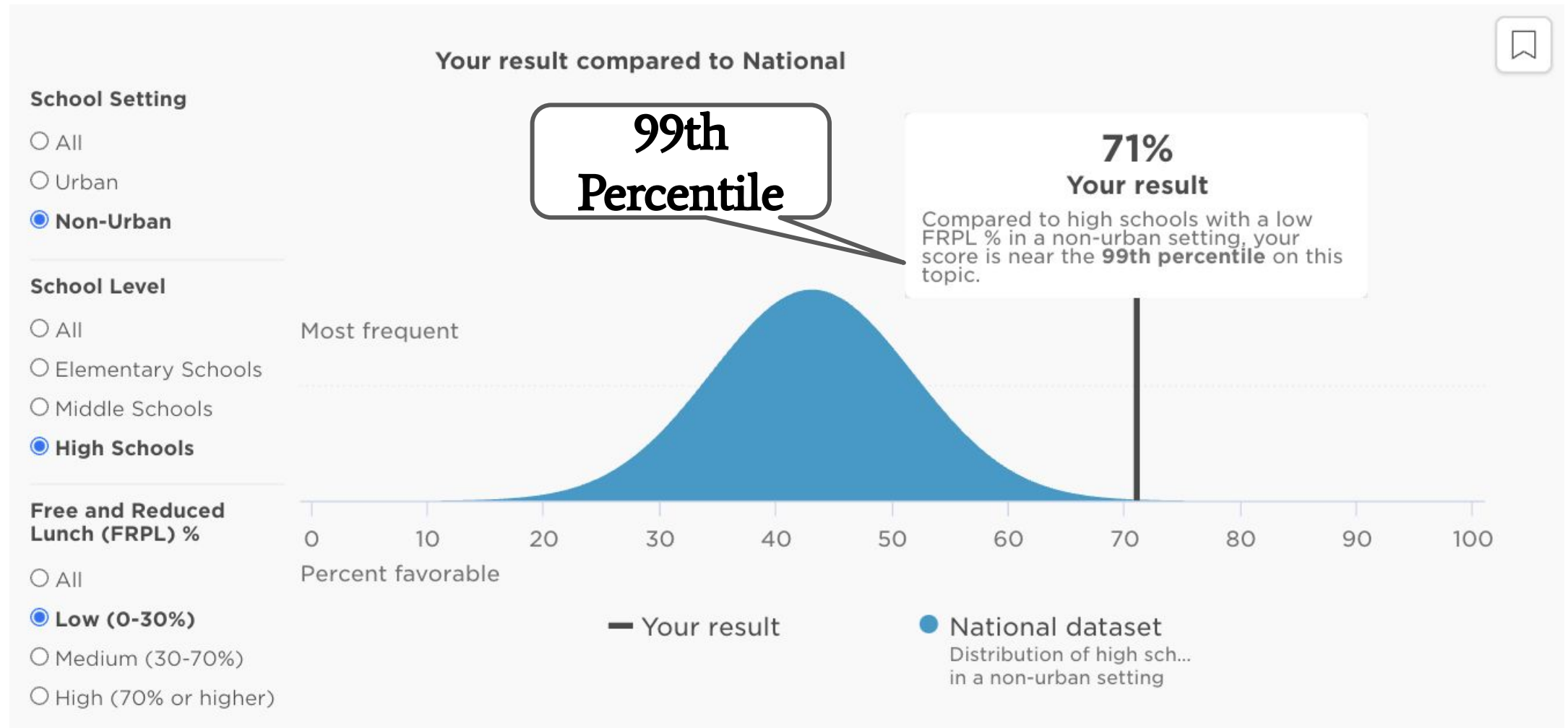
Percent Favorable
