However, disaster struck when Jennifer's family home in the Bronx burned down when she was only 9-years-old. "We were going to bed when smoke started appearing under a door. The house was catching fire and we didn't have time to do anything," she told FIFA.com in near-perfect Spanish. "We were left in the street and they took us to a shelter where they help you to find a home. It takes some people years, but we left after only six months. We were really lucky," continued the goalkeeper.

Jennifer found an outlet at The East Harlem School in her poetry. She wrote and wrote and wrote about her family and her new home. Her poem, "Train Lullaby" was featured in the 2015 EHS Poetry Slam.



Our first day there, The train knocked my dad's special box, The one with the hummingbird on it, The one he brought all the way from Uruguay, Right off the shelf. But we didn't care, we had a home. After six months in a shelter, A rumbling train wouldn't stop us, From loving, loving our new apartment, Even if it was louder than a herd of wildebeest, Even if it woke us up every twenty five minutes.
