This week we want to tell you about the next part of our reading VIPERS. I is for INFERENCE.

Inferencing is often tricky because children have to use evidence from a text, think about what they already know and put it together to explain why a character has done something or why something happened in a story.

When reading with your child, look out for places where you know what is happening, how a character is feeling, or why an action happened but the author did not explicitly state it.

Then:

Pause and consider what evidence you used in the text and what you already knew to make the inference and ask your child questions to help lead them to use text evidence and his/her own knowledge and life experiences to make the inference.
