Multi-tiered systems of support ensure our students receive academic and counseling support throughout the school year and summer. We will offer six targeted summer support programs in 2021. Counselors provide support to students individually, in small groups, or as a class in social skills, navigating friendships, building healthy relationships, and dealing with challenges. Throughout the summer, counselors continue outreach to many of our students to ensure well-being. Social-emotional well-being for students and staff will be a central focus this fall. SEL is woven into our curriculum, counseling practices, and PD. We have an established process to identify WiFi needs for all students. Those who need access at home are provided free WiFi. All students in grades 6-12 are issued a Chromebook. Families of K-5 students who do not have a device at home will be issued a district Chromebook. Students eligible for free or reduced meals are offered daily breakfast and/or lunch.

This plan was discussed with Teachers' Association leadership and was also included as an agenda item at the June 14 Board of Education meeting, at which the public was invited to comment.
