



BETTER CARE GUIDE: HEALTH INSURANCE – Here are some tips when it comes to resolving a denied claim for medical services. When you speak to someone, write down a name, your case number, and the date and time of the call. To get the best customer service from a health insurance company, document everything and <u>keep meticulous</u> <u>records.</u> The next tip is to <u>highlight your bill.</u> Use a fluorescent marker to set apart any items that aren't clear, and make a note to ask about them. That's a great way to be organized and stay on message. Follow up every phone call with documentation confirming the conversation in writing, which you can fax or mail to the insurance company.

Lastly, find your Consumer Assistance Program (CAP). If all other efforts fail, more than half of U.S. states have a CAP that will file an appeal on your behalf. It can be difficult to get in touch with a CAP representative, but it's worth the effort. Don't delay this step. You must file an internal appeal within six months of receiving a claim denial. If the insurer denies your appeal, request an external review. (Thanks to AARP Bulletin.)
