By taking all the classes, you will be a CTE pathway completer for two pathways and be to apply for certain scholarships and will graduate with cords and a medallion.

AS YOU PREPARE TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES FOR NEXT YEAR HERE ARE SOME OF THE ELECTIVE OFFERINGS IN SOCIAL STUDIES CURRENTLY BEING TAUGHT AND A BRIEF EXPLANATION FOR EACH CLASS:

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Introduction to Philosophy – An investigation into existence; examines life, the universe, and everything. This class is about asking questions and thinking about the world around us.

AP Psychology – Looks at how/why we think and behave the way we do (this is a year-long academically rigorous course intended to be at a college level in terms of curriculum – there is no prerequisite other than a willingness to put forth sincere effort). (Juniors and Seniors Only)

Psychology – An introduction into how/why we think and behave the way we do. It is a shorter (semester long) version of Psychology where we discuss many of the same themes as the AP course, but with less depth.

Sociology – The study of how social institutions affect the way we interact as humans. In other words, we look at the groups we take part in and how they change us as people – we will discuss a wide range of topics from immigration to relationships (love and marriage) to social cliques at East.

AP COMPUTER SCIENCE

AP Computer Science Principles is an introductory college-level computing course that introduces students to the breadth of the field of computer science. Students learn to design and evaluate solutions and to apply computer science to solve problems through the development of algorithms and programs. They incorporate abstraction into programs and use data to discover new knowledge. Students also explain how computing innovations and computing systems—including the internet work, explore their potential impacts, and contribute to a computing culture that is collaborative and ethical.

AP CAPSTONE DIPOLMA

AP Seminar is a class designed to improve student research and presentation skills through a combination of individual and group research projects intended primarily for 10th and/or 11th graders. In the course, students learn how to research and write cross curricular academic papers, create multimedia presentations, and discuss topics using peer reviewed evidence to support their thinking. The AP Seminar course is generally taken as the first of two courses taken in succession for students working to achieve the AP Capstone Diploma, which culminates with the AP Research course meant for 11th/12th graders. Commercial Photo 1- year long. Art or CTE credit.

This course introduces basic Digital Photography concepts with DSLR cameras covers Photoshop as an editing tool and provides guidance to present your work as an artist. This class will follow the Utah CTE requirements for <u>Digital Photography</u>. Check out the <u>Career Pathway</u>!

Advanced Commercial Photography- year long. Concurrent Enrollment. Art or CTE credit.

This course is part of a sequence of courses that prepares individuals to use artistic techniques combined with a commercial perspective to effectively communicate ideas and information to business and consumer audiences via the use of advanced digital and/or film photography. Instruction includes training in career opportunities, workflow, specialized camera, equipment and accessories, memory devices, software operation, copyright, ethics, and legal issues as it applies to commercial and industrial needs, and photography business operations.

This course is designed for students who want to further enhance their photographic knowledge and abilities. It is an application of the skills learned in Commercial Photography with an emphasis on professional jobs and assignments used in commercial photography. A portfolio of each student's work is expected at the end of the course.

This course will follow the Utah CTE requirements for <u>Commercial Photography 2</u>. Aligns with this <u>Career Pathway</u>.
