

## HONOR ROLLS

- I. **Purpose.** To establish the Superintendent's expectations for publication of student honor rolls in the BCSD.
- II. The administration encourages and fosters development of intellectual student ability, desirable traits of character and qualities of leadership. The administration will support programs recognizing outstanding student achievement far in excess of minimum requirements in these areas. These programs may include honor rolls, honor societies, special awards or special recognition at honors programs and/or commencement exercises.
- III. The Superintendent directs the certified staff to develop procedures for these recognition programs to focus on core academic areas and honor scholarship and/or distinguished service by students in any school activity. The criteria and procedures will make clear the relationship between the honor and the relevant goal or goals of the schools.
- IV. Criteria for Honor Rolls are as follows:
  - A. High Schools.
    1. A student will be named to the **“School’s Mascot” Distinguished Honor Roll** if he/she has no letter grade below a B for that grading period.
    2. A student will be named to the **Principal’s Honor Roll** if he/she has no grade less than an A for that grading period.
  - B. Middle Schools.
    1. A student will be named to the Principal’s Honor Roll if he/she ~~has no grade less than Attains a grade of 93 or above~~ in all subjects/classes for that grading period.
    2. A student will be named to the Honor Roll if he/she ~~has no grade below a Attains a grade of 85 or above~~ in all subjects/classes for that grading period.
  - C. Elementary Schools.
    1. Elementary Schools Providing Numeric Grades.
      - a. A student will be named to the Principal’s Honor Roll if he/she ~~has no grade less than Attains a grade of 93 or above~~ in all subjects/classes for that grading period, ~~excepting related arts.~~
      - b. A student will be named to the Honor Roll if he/she ~~has no grade less than Attains a grade of 85 or above~~ in all subjects/classes for that grading period, ~~excepting related arts.~~

3. Elementary schools that do not provide numeric grades will develop criteria to honor students for academic excellence.
4. All elementary schools will recognize scholarship independently of citizenship as part of the honor roll process.
