Here is what I found: there was a rather significant addition made to this regulation, during Dr. Moss' tenure, that was not part of the 2001 regulation. Furthermore, the Board was not informed of this addition/change. I've poured over meeting agendas and minutes to see if the Board was informed of this addition/change, but there is no record of the Board being informed of, nor endorsing, this addition/change. I was also unable to find similar text in our BCSD Procurement Code which might support this change.

The following section was added during Dr. Moss' tenure:

"V. Delegation of Authority to Award Contracts. Except as otherwise required by law, the Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to award BCSD contracts for the purchase of equipment, material and supplies in any amount, as long as the purchase is within the remaining funds in the allocated budget for the current fiscal year. At this time, Dr. Jackie Rosswurm was serving as our interim superintendent, but Dr. Moss was present in the audience. According to Dr. Moss' employment contract, Dr. Moss was at that time a paid consultant by the BCSD as he was transitioning into his role as superintendent.

During the May 21, 2013 meeting, the Board was asked to transfer \$417K from funds earmarked for iPad repairs to be used for iPad purchases instead. All,

Here is an example illustrating why the differentiation between administrative regulations and Board policies is relevant. If you compare the 2001 and 2016 versions (I am waiting to receive a copy of the 2015 version) of Policy OS-13 Procurement and Purchasing (previously referred to as an administrative regulation), you will see that a rather significant stipulation was added in February 2016. A thorough review of minutes reveals this change was not presented to the Board for information as it should have been.

Here's the added text. It gives the false appearance that the Board ceded uthority to the superintendent on certain matters, when in fact the Board did not. A rather large liberty was taken in adding this text to this "policy", which does not align with any Board action nor passages in our Procurement Code:

"V. Delegation of Authority to Award Contracts. Except as otherwise required by law, the Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to award BCSD contracts for the purchase of equipment, material and supplies in any amount, as long as the purchase is within the remaining funds in the allocated budget for the current fiscal year. The Superintendent may seek Board approval for certain expenditures. The Purchasing officer and any additional staff deemed appropriate by the Superintendent shall review submission of bids, proposals or quotes to determine if they are responsive to BCSD specifications, and will make recommendations to the Superintendent. The Superintendent or designee shall award the contract based upon such recommendations or shall make a recommendation to the Board for award of the contract by the Board in accordance with this policy."

Subject: Re: Administrative Regulations v. Board Policies

All,

Here is an example illustrating why the differentiation between administrative regulations and Board policies is relevant. If you compare the 2001 and 2016 versions (I am waiting to receive a copy of the 2015 version) of Policy OS-13 Procurement and Purchasing (previously referred to as an administrative regulation), you will see that a rather significant stipulation was added in February 2016. A thorough review of minutes reveals this change was not presented to the Board for information as it should have been.

Here's the added text. It gives the false appearance that the Board ceded authority to the superintendent on certain matters, when in fact the Board did not. A rather large liberty was taken in adding this text to this "policy", which does not align with any Board action nor passages in our Procurement Code:

"V. Delegation of Authority to Award Contracts. Except as otherwise required by law, the Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to award BCSD contracts for the purchase of equipment, material and supplies in any amount, as long as the purchase is within the remaining funds in the allocated budget for the current fiscal year. The Superintendent may seek Board approval for certain expenditures. The Purchasing officer and any additional staff deemed appropriate by the Superintendent shall review submission of bids, proposals or quotes to determine if they are responsive to BCSD specifications, and will make recommendations to the Superintendent. The Superintendent or designee shall award the contract based upon such recommendations or shall make a recommendation to the Board for award of the contract by the Board in accordance with this policy."

Interesting stuff.
