This is called Strategic Governance. It can work, but only with rigorous Oversight. The previous Administration and Board “discouraged” real oversight, with the Administration stage managing any attempts at it by those who were working for reform.

> The result is that the Board has developed an attitude and belief that it is more of an advisory function, that we have to “trust the professionals” and accept the Superintendent as the “12th Member of the Board”. The concept of a Governing Body has been watered down to an extreme. We discussed the budget for nearly two hours Thursday before it dawned on some that we should make Motions and not just state opinions.

>

> The Finance Committee of the Board is zeroing in on some very important areas and is to be encouraged in that focus. For now, at the Board level, it is still considered “the administration’s budget” and not the Board’s. That’s just my opinion, but it’s not the first time I’ve encountered the symptoms.
