While spelling bees have been taking place since as early as 1850, most of us are familiar with the Courier Journal Spelling Bee, later renamed as the Scripps National Spelling Bee, which started in 1925. In recent years, the Scripps National Spelling Bee has aired on national networks such as ESPN. The Consolidated Word List for the Scripps National Spelling Bee has over 24,000 words for students to study!



The word list used at Creekside didn't quite reach 24,000 words, but each grade level's spelling bee went many rounds as students demonstrated their mastery of the English language. Rounds were facilitated by three wonderful parent volunteers who ensured that students heard the word correctly, were given information about the word and listened to each word for the correct spelling.

The top three 6th graders and top two 5th graders will go on to compete in the SEMMLAA competition on Saturday, November 13th in Milan at the middle school. Representing Dexter in the 6th Grade will be Kadence

Chan, Liam Grimm and Maggie Meek. In 5th Grade, Caroline Fealy and Grayson Hardesty will represent Creekside. We are sure that their classmates will be cheering them on and providing fist bumps from afar. Now *that* is
