



Bird's Eye View with Fr. Pellican



Advent is one of my favorite seasons. In contrast to the hustle of the world, there's a simplicity to Advent in the life of the Church. We're waiting, waiting for the arrival, the advent of our Lord. beginning of the Roman Missal

describes the season as follows: "Advent has a two-fold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight."

Last week, as we came to the end of the liturgical year, we celebrated the feast of Christ the King, calling to mind that Jesus is our king, and that he will be coming back in glory. As we begin Advent, we continue to anticipate Christ's Second Coming, while also turning our attention to His First Coming at Bethlehem. In addition to these two arrivals, St. Bernard of Clairvaux speaks of a third, invisible advent of Christ, occurring in the interim. Between that first Christmas and the end of time, Christ comes inwardly to our hearts and souls.

What a beautiful truth to reflect on this Advent. Instructing us about how to receive Christ in this intermediary coming, St. Bernard says the following: "Let [God's word] enter into your very being, let it take possession of your desires and your whole way of life. Feed on goodness, and your soul will delight in its richness. Remember to eat your bread, or your heart will wither away. Fill your soul with richness and strength."

St. Bernard speaks of letting God's word penetrate our whole being, and eating the bread of the Eucharist. These are the two parts of the Mass: the Liturgy of the Word, where we hear God's word and let it change us, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, where we receive His body and blood under the appearance of bread. How might we better prepare our hearts and souls this Advent to receive Jesus, our glorious King and Divine Child?





DIVINE CHILD RELICS OF THE WEEK

St. Andrew the Apostle: Feast Day November 30 Patron of Fishermen & singers

Divine Child has 43 Relics in our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel and St. Andrew & St. Francis Xavier are two of them!



You may view a list of DC's relics located on the bookshelf in the Adoration Chapel.

St. Andrew, also known as Andrew the Apostle, was a Christian Apostle and the older brother to St. Peter. Andrew was one of the closer disciples to Jesus.

Per Christian tradition, Andrew went on to preach the Good News around the shores of the Black Sea and throughout what is now Greece and Turkey. Andrew was martyred by crucifixion in Patras. He was bound, rather than nailed, to a cross, as is described in the Acts of Andrew. He was crucified on a cross form known as "crux decussata," which is an X-shaped cross or a "saltire." Today this is commonly referred to as "St. Andrew's Cross." It is believed Andrew requested to be crucified this way, because he deemed himself "unworthy to be crucified on the same type of cross as Jesus."

St. Francis Xavier: Feast Day December 3 Patron Saint of Roman Catholic Missions

St. Francis Xavier was born into a very prominent family in the Navarre, Spain on April 7, 1506. His mother was the heiress of the houses of Azpilcueta and Xavier. His father Don Juan de Jasso was a counselor to the King of Navarre. Francis was the youngest of several brothers, all of whom pursued careers in the military. Francis, having a more gentle nature, was sent by his parents in 1525 to study scholastic philosophy at the College of St. Barbara in Paris.

In 1529 Francis met St. Ignatius Loyola and helped him start an order The Society of Jesus, otherwise known as the Jesuits. In 1542 Xavier traveled to western India where he began a ministry to preach and serve the poor. He then traveled to Japan in 1549, teaching and converting thousands of people. Xavier later returned to India and died on December 2, 1552.

St. Francis Xavier was canonized with St. Ignatius Loyola in 1622. In his ten years as a missionary, he converted tens of thousands of people in Asia and traveled to more territories than any other missionary before the era of modern means of travel. Pope Urban VIII named him the "Apostle of the Indies." St. Francis Xavier is considered the greatest missionary of the Church since the Apostles. His body is enshrined in a church in Goa in India, and his feast day is celebrated on December 3.



A Human Sexuality Course for Teens!

Teen STAR is a Catholic formation program on human sexuality for teens. By learning about their changing bodies, teens are guided to integrate this knowledge while considering all aspects of who they are, made in God's image (social, emotional, intellectual, physical, and spiritual) with the goal of living a virtuous life. This course will be 10 to 12 weeks long and meet once a week for an hour starting in January. The girls will be in a class with Lauren Vitale, BSN, RN and the boys will be with Giovanni Vitale, MA, LLP. Teen STAR is approved by the Archdiocese of Detroit.

Teen STAR has opened the door for me to talk with my daughter about topics that we would probably not have discussed otherwise. It has empowered her with knowledge about her body and, best of all, she is now firmly committed to be chaste and to waiting until she is married to have sex. I wish that I would have had a program like this when I was in 8th grade!

First Sunday of Advent

As we begin this holy season of Advent, we should consider taking inventory of our lives. In today's Gospel from the evangelist St. Luke, Jesus tells of the signs associated with the end times. For faithful disciples, though, Christ reassures us: But when these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand. In other words, stand firm in your faith before the Lord when He comes again in glory and power. St. Paul reminds the Thessalonian community, and us, that our Lord strengthens us to love God and one another — to be blameless in holiness before Him. Faithful stewards acknowledge that expressing evangelization through stewardship as a way of life deepens our quest for holiness. As we prepare for Christ's birth, avoid the busyness of the "holiday season" by making time to read Scripture daily and attend Mass frequently to receive Holy Communion.






