

Secondary Campus Dress Code / School Uniform

All IST students are expected to dress in a respectful and appropriate manner. The aims of this expectation are as follows:

- To create a positive and respectful environment conducive to teaching and learning.
- To honour the diversity in our community by showing consideration and sensitivity for cultural and/or religious beliefs and values.
- To understand the importance of appropriate and tasteful dress in an educational and/or professional environment.

Students are expected to change into their PE uniform every PE lesson. PE uniform is: Sports shorts, and IST PE shirt (can be bought through Option 1) , athletic shoes and socks. Swimming lessons require appropriate swimming costume and towel (goggles are advised). Students are strongly advised to bring a hat, to apply sunscreen and bring a water bottle for outdoor activities. **Students may come dressed in their PE shirt if they have class period 1. Afterwards they are expected to change into the IST uniform.**

IST polo shirts can be purchased at the Secondary Campus Admissions Office.

Theme Dress Days

On occasion various student groups may be given permission to organize a Theme Dress Day for secondary students. However, regardless of the theme, students are expected dress appropriately and consider the IST Dress Code.

Parent Expectations

Parents are expected to help by monitoring the dress of their children before they leave for school. Parents will be called to bring in appropriate attire, should the student be in violation of the Dress Code.

Consequences

If a student is out of school uniform or does not abide by the dress code, then the following disciplinary actions will be taken:

- Homeroom Advisor/classroom teacher documents the infraction on SEQTA , informs team leader and parents. Students must make "fashion adjustments" by changing attire or calling home for appropriate attire, before returning to class.
- After three warnings (3) during the semester, then parents will be required to accompany their son/daughter to school to briefly meet with the Team Leader or Principal/Vice Principal before school.
- If a student receives five (5) warnings during the semester, then s/he will lose school privileges which may include off-campus privileges (Grade 12 only) and representing IST on school-sponsored trips (ISSEA/Athletics, MUN, ISTA, Mt. Meru, Mt. Kili, etc.)

Grade 6 - 10	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Blue, grey, or yellow IST shirt or ISSEA black travel shirt in good repair. • Solid color only-Hoodie (including IST), sweatshirt, sweater with/without a logo. • Black, navy or khaki bottoms in good repair (no rips), including skirts, capris, skorts, shorts, trousers, and blue or black jeans. • No visible undergarments. • Navy or black leggings with the top covering the pelvis while standing. • All bottoms must be at most 3 inches/8 cm above the knee, measured from the top of the knee cap. • No clothing with offensive slogans or references to drugs, alcohol, and profanity. • Footwear in good repair. • PHE Uniform (see next column)
Grade 11 - 12	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Collared shirt, blouse or T-shirt in good repair. • Solid color only-Hoodie (including IST), sweatshirt, sweater with/without a logo. • Tops or dresses where the straps are at least 4.5 cm wide, no midriff or cleavage showing. • Bottoms in good repair (no rips), including skirts, capris, skorts, shorts, trousers, and jeans. • No visible undergarments. • Dark leggings with the top covering the pelvis while standing; • All bottoms must be at most 3 inches/8 cm above the knee, measured from the top of the knee cap. • No clothing with offensive slogans or references to drugs, alcohol, and profanity. • Footwear in good repair.
