Term 2

Swords and Sandals

ENGLISH

This term in English the pupils will be studying the text 'The Adventures of Odysseus' and 'Who Let The Gods Out?' They will use the texts to inspire their own work, beginning

with a unit on story-telling. The pupils will develop skills to enable them to empathise with characters, discuss themes within the text and retell the stories with focus on description within their own exciting portal stories. After this, the pupils will write a report on the day Odysseus challenges the suitors.

We will continue to practise spellings on a weekly basis (both statutory words and spelling patterns learnt throughout the week) and carry out regular handwriting lessons.

MATHS

This term, pupils will be continuing work on the four operations. We will be looking at vocabulary such as factors, prime numbers and multiples. Then we will focus mainly on fractions. The term begins with simplifying, ordering and comparing fraction using their knowledge of common factors and multiples. They will then move onto adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators. The pupils will learn how to multiply and divide fractions by whole numbers and then move onto make comparisons between fractions, decimals and percentages. On Mathletics, areas to support the learning this term are located under the 'Fractions', 'Fractions Calculating' and 'Decimal and Percentages' headings.

WIDER CURRICULUM FOCUS

The pupils will be developing their understanding of Ancient Greece. Through research and other hands on activities, the pupils will discover fascinating facts about the Greek way of life during this time. They will have the opportunity to compare different states such as Sparta and Athens and look for similarities and differences between the two. On top of this, we will look at warfare and the tactics used in



battle by the Ancient Greeks. As the unit continues, the pupils will have the opportunity to learn about clothing, trade and the incredible mythical creatures and legends of this time, as well as the legacy left behind.

The pupils will be extending their learning journey topic by exploring the artistic side of the Ancient Greeks! Pupils will learn about Greek-style clay pottery. They will research Greek vases and they will then get the opportunity to design, create and evaluate their own Greek vase based on the research

RE

This term, we will be exploring the importance of Jesus to Christians and the relevance that he has to their lives and their faith.

EVOLUTION OF ME

The pupils will be looking at safe relationships and caring friendships. These topics will involve focusing on recognising and managing pressure within a relationship and also supporting friends in difficult situations.
