Keeping safe online

Last month, we shared the link to <u>NSPCC Net Aware</u> which allows parents and carers to learn more about popular social media apps and other streaming platforms. Needless to say, apps such as <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Instagram</u> have age restrictions due to the content that children could be exposed to. However, apps such as <u>Roblox</u>—which have a much lower age restriction - also contain parental controls that could support you and your child's use of them. The search engine from <u>Net Aware</u> gives you direct access to all age restrictions and instructions for parental control, including for sites such as <u>Netflix</u> and for the chat/sharing options on popular video game consoles. Further information can be <u>found here</u> to support you and your child to make the best of their online time and remain safe at every available opportunity.


Recommended Read (Upper KS2)

Reception and Year 6 National Childhood Measurement Programme

This week, parents. Carers in Reception and Year 6 would have received a Parentmail sharing information about school visits by East Sussex School Health Service. They have asked us to share this information with you:

The National Childhood Measurement Programme (NCMP)

Every year in England, children in Reception and Year 6 have their height and weight measured as part of the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP). Your child's class will take part in this year's measurement programme. The NCMP provides information to help build an understanding of national and local trends in children's weight. It is important to have a good understanding of how children are growing, so that the best possible advice and support can be provided for them and their families.

The measurements will be carried out by trained school health staff at school in a private space away from other pupils. Children who take part will be measured fully clothed except for their coats and shoes. Routine data, such as your child's name, date of birth, gender, address, postcode and ethnicity will also be collected.

Data from all schools in the area will be gathered together and held securely by East Sussex County Council's Public Health Team. Please note that your child's information is stored on their child health record. **No individual measurements will be given to school staff or other children and all information will be treated confidentially.**


Swifts - Oliver
