i. Participation in Coordinated Transportation - MOESC

WHEREAS, The Monmouth-Ocean Educational Services Commission, with offices at 900 Green Grove Road, Tinton Falls, New Jersey 07712 (hereinafter referred to as the “MOESC”), and the Edison Township Board of Education, with offices at 312 Pierson Avenue, Edison, New Jersey 08837 (hereinafter referred to as “Board of Education”) has agreed as follows:

RECITALS

A. The Board of Education desires to transport special education, nonpublic, public and/or vocational school students to specific destinations.

B. The MOESC offers coordinated transportation services.

C. The MOESC will organize and schedule routes to achieve the maximum cost effectiveness.

NOW, THEREFORE,  
IT IS AGREED:

that in consideration of prorated contract costs calculated by the billing formula adopted by the MOESC, plus an administrative fee of 5.5 percent (5.5%), the Edison Township Board of Education shall pay the MOESC for transportation services rendered. Said formula shall be based on the number of students and a per pupil mile ratio encumbering any special requirements specified by participating districts.

1. The MOESC will provide the following services:
  - a. Routes coordinated with other districts, whenever possible, to achieve a maximum cost reduction while maintaining a realistic capacity and travel time;
  - b. An estimated fee for all routes based on a ratio of the number of students and student mileage. It is understood that initial transportation charges are estimated based on initial mileage and ridership and thereby subject to changes as the number of students and/or mileage increases and/or decreases;
  - c. Monthly billing and invoices;
  - d. A report of students for all routes coordinate by MOESC;
  - e. All necessary interaction and communication between the sending district, receiving school, and respective transportation contractors;
  - f. Constant review and revision of routes;
  - g. Provide transportation within three (3) days or sooner after receipt of the formal written request; and (2)

IT IS FURTHER  
AGREED:

that the Edison Township Board of Education will provide the MOESC with the following:

- a. Requests for special transportation on approved forms to be provided by the MOESC, completed in full and signed by authorized district personnel;
- b. Withdrawal for any transportation must be provided in writing and signed by authorized district personnel; no billing adjustments will be made without this completed form and will become effective on the date the form is received.
- c. Additional Cost – All additional costs generated by unique requests such as mid-day runs or early dismissals will be borne by the district making the request. All such costs must first be approved by the Edison Township Board of Education.
- d. Length of Agreement – This Agreement and obligations and requirements therein shall be in effect between October 1, 2021 and June 30, 2023.
- e. Entire Agreement – The Agreement constitutes the entire and only agreement between the parties and may be amended by any instrument in writing over authorized signature; and (3)

IT IS FURTHER  
AGREED:

by the Board of Education to the following:

- a. Upon the execution of this Agreement, it is agreed that MOESC’s school bus contractor, selected pursuant to the public bidding law, shall exclusively provide pupil transportation services for the identified student during the term of the Contract.

b. The Board of Education may terminate this contract only for good cause. Good cause shall not be defined to include a lesser transportation cost alternative available to the Board of Education during the term of the Contract. Good cause includes, but shall not be limited to the following: (1) the student’s parent electing to provide transportation for the student for the entire contract term; (2) the student no longer requires the transportation services because the student does not need to travel to the transportation contract’s destination because the student’s education plan has changed, the school assignment is changed for education-based reasons, the student has moved from the school district, the student’s pupil transportation is merged with other route(s) to reduce cost, or for other good cause shown.

## X. Committee Meetings

### 1. Finance & Facilities Committee

The Finance and Facilities Committee met on September 20, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. in the Education Center.

In attendance were: Bernard F. Bragen, Jr., Ed.D., Edward Aldarelli, Ed.D., Ann T. Kluck, Ralph Barca, Mohin Patel, Jingwei “Jerry” Shi, Elizabeth Conway and Dr. Yunxia Chen

#### Items Discussed:

- Mr. Barca presented on the findings of the Tech Audit Report by Cyberfire IT Solutions. Overall, the findings were very favorable with minimal points of concern. Some areas of improvement were: Use multi-factor authentication for login, outdated software versions on older machines, passwords less than 8 characters and compromised passwords. All these concerns have been or are being addressed by the Technology Department. In addition, the report listed some staffing concerns that the District plans to address via outsourcing during those times of high demand. Mr. Barca will follow up with a proposal for this in the near future.
- Representatives from DMR (Pradeep and Kurt) presented updates/proposals for several projects:
  - John P. Stevens High School Addition – 180 square feet – Thirty-two total additional classrooms. Most likely a three-phase project. Estimated costs between \$87 million to \$96 million and three years until final completion.
  - John P. Stevens High School Turf Field – this is currently under review from the NJDEP and the Committee will be updated upon their approval.
  - The DCO will present on a phasing model for an ESIP at the next committee meeting scheduled for October 12, 2021.
- Dr. Bragen reported on the current status of the financial wellbeing of the District and that all items are currently falling within the budget projections, most importantly, those costs related to healthcare concerns are aligned to expectations. He also reported that the only real damage to the school system that came from the recent storms was the small gym at Edison High School, which might necessitate a full replacement. An insurance claim was submitted and they will determine the exact costs.
- Lincoln Project Update – There are some issues with the steel subcontractor and in order to stay within the completion deadlines, there will be a need to change the design of the gym slightly. It is anticipated that these changes will not impact the overall design or space and will not significantly increase any costs. This change is currently being reviewed by Edison’s architect and attorney. In addition, the initial plumbing contractors were changed and the new plumber selected is a local vendor.
- ESSERS III Funds – To be aligned with the requirements for these federal monies, the \$7.8 million attributed to capital improvements will be designated for HVAC upgrades, possibly across several projects.
- School Bus Purchases – In order to take a proactive stand regarding future transportation needs, the District is looking to secure a number of buses for the next school year and Dr. Bragen will get anticipated prices and associated costs for review at a future meeting.
- Our Saviors church Purchase – Prior to scheduling the closing of this property, a restriction listed in the current deed needs to be addressed. The Board Attorney is currently reviewing this and will keep the Board apprised of the status.



2. Finance & Facilities Committee

The Curriculum and Technology Committee met on October 12, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. via ZOOM.

In attendance were: Mohin Patel, Dr. Yunxia Chen, Elizabeth Conway, Jingwei “Jerry” Shi, Ann T. Kluck, Edward Aldarelli, Ed.D., and Bernard F. Bragen, Jr., Ed.D.

Items Discussed:

- Demographic Study – Two companies presented their proposals for conducting a demographic study of the District. The companies were Statistical Forecasting and Davis Demographics. After hearing both presentations, the Committee felt that the District should explore other options and solicit companies based in New Jersey. They also plan to contact the previous demographer to review the costs for updating that information.
- DMR Architects – Representatives from DMR presented on the proposed addition to John P. Stevens High School and they agreed to present on this at a future Board of Education Meeting to share the proposal with the full Board and the public. The Committee is waiting on final approval from the Department of Environmental Protection Agency for the proposed turf baseball field at John P. Stevens High School.

DMR also reviewed the benefits of a do-it-yourself approach to conducting an Energy Savings Improvement program (ESIP). This can generate more savings for the District and also update some of the HVAC systems and lighting in the schools. They will provide more information as this program unfolds.

Dr. Bragen shared that the owners of the vacant property on Talmadge and Coolidge Roads is no longer interested in a lend/lease agreement with the District and only offering a sale for approximately \$9 million. DMR representatives proposed possible lease agreements with another buyer who could buy the property, build a school and then lease it to the District. They will get more information on this for further discussion at future meetings.

- Lincoln Elementary School Update – Dr. Bragen stated that the Lincoln Addition Project is on schedule in all areas with the exception of the gym, which will be delayed due to shortages and delays in securing the steel for the prefabricated building. This could push back that portion of the construction until December 2022; however, the classrooms and the rest of the addition is still scheduled to open September 2022.

**XII. BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION**

Dr. Bragen discussed the issues with Middlesex Water Company and the impact on several schools in Edison.

Mrs. Madhukar asked that the committee minutes be sent in a timely manner.

Mrs. White discussed the purpose of the Township Liaison Committee is to have an open dialog with the Township and the Board of Education. The next meeting is scheduled for November 9, 2021.

Mr. Shi reported that the Township Liaison Committee is not a new committee and the ETEA's debate of filling vacancies process has not changed.

Mrs. Bodofsky stated that she is proud to see students partaking in the board meetings.

Mr. M. Patel commended Mrs. White in the job she is doing with the Liaison Committee. He asked Mrs. Conway to keep politics at home and discussed food issues at the elementary schools and hopes to visit all nineteen schools.

Mrs. White spoke about John P. Stevens High School and Woodrow Wilson Middle School.

Mrs. Peng stated there were no lunch lines at John P. Stevens High School. Woodrow Wilson had a five minute wait and the variety of food is much better and the portions are okay.

Mrs. Madhukar asked for the committee minutes to be posted with the agenda. She discussed the purpose of the demographic study and the growth of the student body to get Edison numbers. She asked if the Board has given up on getting a third high school. The student body is increasing, but clubs and sports are the same – more competition and less opportunity.

**XIII. PUBLIC COMMENTS**

A resident asked for more elementary and middle school clubs. He discussed tardiness and excused absences in schools.

A resident spoke about a relative who was assaulted in the girls' bathroom at Edison High School and has been bullied in school.

Maria – stated that the Environmental Club needs student representatives. She stated there will be a Trunk or Treat on 10/30/21 from 9:30 A.m. to 12:30 P.M. She also discussed open space and the need for more crossing guards.

A resident discussed the inappropriate language used by elected officials. She also discussed transportation, free busing and subscription busing.

Joyce Ship-Freeman, resident, discussed proper decorum at board meetings. She felt a new school is important and questioned a filtration system for the schools.

Rich Sweeney, resident asked if the Board knew who owned a green building next to John Marshall Elementary School which is an eyesore. He also commended Principal Ami Hoffman of John Marshall Elementary School for always going above and beyond to help her students.

Christo Makroupolus, resident, discussed a newspaper article regarding a Board Member.

Tony DePasquale, resident, stated that the citizens of Edison hold the Board of Education accountable for their actions.

Charles Ross, Edison High School Principal, encouraged everyone to attend the Drama Club production of Arsenic and Old Lace. He also reported that the Edison High School Eagles Soccer Team will be playing the John P. Stevens Hawks on Monday, November 1<sup>st</sup>.

Mr. Shi spoke about the Edison High School Girls' Soccer Team and stated that the John P. Stevens Band won all top prizes at their recent competition.

A resident asked if the Emergency Instructional Plan is required by the State and if it will be on the website.
