

Current Statistics:

- 91% of the East students who took IB exams were awarded passing grades in the May 2021 assessment session.
- 100% of last year's Diploma Candidates earned the highly respected IB Diploma from Geneva, Switzerland.
- 46% of our juniors and seniors are taking at least one IB course.
- 25% of our IB students are minority students.
- 26 IB students are Diploma Candidates taking 6 IB courses, the Theory of Knowledge Course, writing a 4,000-word senior thesis, and completing at least 150 hours of community participation and service.

Students in health class have been busy learning new skills. Students learned that health is more than physical wellness. They examined the 10 dimensions of wellness

and took a deeper look at where they have strengths and areas for improvement. The next skill the students examined and applied was Accessing Accurate and Credible Information. 87 percent of 14- to 22-year-olds report that they research health questions online.

(Hopelab and Wellbeing Trust, 2018)

Students were given the tools to closely examine if a website meets the standard of both accurate and credible. Students demonstrated their learning in the form of a podcast, digital poster, or toilet talk. Next, students examined the skill of Analyzing Influences. They looked closer at who and what influences their choices and how those

influences impact their health.

Kristen Seidler (Wausau PD Victims Advocate) and Michelle Gleason (Peaceful Solutions Executive Director) were both guest speakers on Mental Health providing coping strategies and information on where to get help in school or the community for mental concerns as well as how to help a friend who may be suicidal.

Physical education classes are happy to be back in full swing. The Adventure Based PE students have enjoyed both outdoor and indoor activities including ziplining, rock wall climbing, the giant swing and many more. Net and Partner Games students have learned the basic skills and scoring of tennis and competed in a class tournament while Lumberjack Strength students have been working out using an online program and app called PLT4M. Our Adapted PE students have been improving their cardiovascular endurance while working out in the cardio room and have also been working on their balance skills with the use of an obstacle course and bicycles.

Lifetime Activities students have enjoyed the long, warm fall with many biking and hiking adventures. They were also fortunate to have the opportunity to

learn self-defense, archery, yoga, meditation, and dance. Stay tuned for photos from goat yoga.

ACT Information

As a junior, your child will be taking the ACT on March 8, 2022. The ACT test is a mandatory state assessment that many colleges and universities use to determine admission and scholarships as well. To help prepare our students for this test, we are offering several optional test prep workshops and a mandatory practice ACT test on Dec 7, 2021.

Wausau East Counselors are hosting ACT test prep sessions on Thursdays during Intervention/Enrichment times from 2:30 - 3:00p.m. Students can choose to attend any or all test prep sessions. Topics we focus on include: ACT test format, tips and strategies, time management, subject specific strategies and utilizing Method Test Prep, our test prep platform. Method Test Prep is available to all juniors through Xello. Our last session will be on March 3, 2022.

The ACT practice test will be held on Dec 7, 2021 and the ACT Test will be on March 8, 2022, both held during the regular school day. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact your child's counselor.
