## Dear Parents/Carers

As you know, we continue to work on developing the curriculum in each of our subject areas, and want to ensure you are regularly informed as to the topics and key knowledge and skills that your child is studying. Not only does this give you an overview of what they are working on, it also helps you in supporting your child in their learning at home.

Please find below the summary of what your Year 8 child is working on during Term 2 and the topics and skills that this builds onto in Term 3. This will also include reference to any key events that are taking place within the subjects.

Subject	Content
	This term students are studying Dickens' A Christmas Carol and analysing the language he
English	uses to present characters and themes. Their contextual knowledge of the Victorian era from
	Term 1 will help them understand Dickens overall message in the novella. Their understanding
	of the themes of justice and equality will aid them in their study of Ethical Dilemma's next
	term where they will cover a range of issues to debate.
	This term students will be starting a unit of work called Representations. Building on
Maths	knowledge of coordinates from KS2, we will be looking formally at algebraic rules for straight
	lines, starting with lines parallel to the axes, then moving onto the more general form. We will
	be exploring the concepts of gradient and intercepts, but the focus at this stage is using the
	equations to produce lines. This knowledge will provide the basis for exploring the
	interpretation of m and c from a given equation, which will be covered in Year 9. Students are
	also introduced formally to bivariate data and the idea of linear correlation. They extend their
	knowledge of graphs and charts from Key Stage 2 to deal with both discrete and continuous
	data. In term 3 students will build on their understanding of equivalence from year 7 by
	exploring expanding and factoring, leading onto forming and solving equations. We will
	complete this unit of work by exploring linear sequences. These skills will form the basis of
	exploring quadratic sequences in KS4.
	This term, year 8 build on their previous knowledge of the building blocks in science. In
Science	biology, they will look at tissues and cells, In chemistry they will explore the periodic table and
	in physics they will look at how the particle model explains the density of different materials.
	The key character trait for this term is gratitude.
	Next term, year 8 will learn about extinction, with a focus on the extinction of the dinosaurs.
	They will also learn about the galaxies and solar systems that make up our universe. Students
	will then move on to their third project, where they can choose to present one of extinction,
	the dinosaurs or the universe. Students are encouraged to make these projects their
	own! The key character trait for this term is self-belief.
	In French, Festival and celebrations has been the theme of this term. Pupils will review dates
Modern Foreign	and opinions, talk about French festivals and celebrations, buy food at a market, talk about
Languages	what they are going to eat on a special day, talk about a future trip. Throughout Term 3,
	pupils will be extending that knowledge in order to talk about digital technology, arrange to
	go to the cinema, talk about leisure activities using present and perfect tense together. In
	Spanish, students have been exploring the theme of "Todo sobre mi vida" ("everything about
	my life") where pupils review how to express opinion, talk about using mobile phones, talk
	about music and TV programs preferences. They have used their previous knowledge on the
	past tense and extend their skills using the present tense. Throughout Term 3, pupils will be
	extending that knowledge in order to discuss food preferences, describe mealtimes, order a
	meal, discuss what to buy for a party, give an account of a party.

	In Year 8, Design Technology and Food Technology are taught in rotation. This means that in
Docian	Term 2 and Term 3, students will focus on different topics dependent on their class.
Design	
Technology	DT1) Smooth 'n' Shiny - Enamelled bugs. Students will design and make a decorative bug
	reflecting your research. Students will cut and shape copper plate and apply enamelling
	powder. Students will learn to recognise and describe different 'design movements' and learn
	about the use of enamelling and copper in industry.
	DT2) Night light - Edge lit plastics. Students will learn to use basic electronic components to
	create a light that shines through a plastic plate that they will design. Students will learn to
	recognise and draw electronic components. Students will learn how to solder safely.
	FT1&2) Students will learn to produce dishes that are influenced by availability, season, need
	and cost. Students will learn about and produce dishes that reflect different cultures and
	religions. Students will design, plan and create your own savoury dishes that consider dietary
	needs.
History	In Year 8 term two students will study the Renaissance with a continued focus on 'The
	Tudors'. Once they complete this focus we will in term 3 move onto the 'Stuart' period of
	history specifically looking at the 'English Civil War', 'Glorious Revolution' and 'Witchcraft'.
	Through their study of this period they will continue to develop their understanding of key
	concepts (change & continuity, cause & consequence, chronology) and skills (analysis and
	interpretation).
	In Term 2, students are continuing learning about Kenya. They are focusing on how clean
Geography	water affects development, how national parks are managed and their benefits and
	conservation. Homework presentations this term should be created around a geographical
	topic in an African country. We had some wonderful presentations last term and look forward
	to seeing these the week before Christmas. Next term, students will begin their unit on
	Australia where they will explore the creation and changes of coastlines and how we tackle
	climate change. They will look at types of waves, how erosion shapes the coastline and the
	issues of climate change in the Great Barrier Reef.
	In Term 2, students complete a Mexican Art project. Students learn about Mexican Day of the
Art	Dead and the work of the Linares Family of Mexico City. Students create 'Calvera' (decorated
	skulls) using clay pinch pot techniques. In Term 3, students move on to look at the Figure.
	Students learn to draw the figure using measuring and proportional rules. Students will look
	at Anthony Gormley and Alberto Giacometti before creating monotone acrylic figure
	paintings. The outcome of this project is a figure sculpture using modelling wire.
	Our year 8 dancers are looking at urban dance and its relationship to urban culture, the
Dance	students are working in groups to create a group name, using their bodies the students will
	use transitions to link these letter names using the 5 basic body actions. Alongside this the
	students will learn some basic street dance moves which they will include in their
	choreographed performance at the end of term. We will continue our exploration of different
	dance cultures with a focus on Matthew Bourne's Nutcracker and Martial arts after Christmas.
	After learning a set phrase based on The Nutcracker the students will develop their own
	action/ reaction & contact sequence inspired by the new genres of dance they have explored
	this term.
	Our Year 8 students have been exploring the Charles Dickens story of A Christmas Carol which
Drama	aligns with the English department. We have been using scripts to develop character work
	and rehearsal techniques such as hot seating. As the term progresses students will perform
	key scenes from the play which they have memorised. We look forward to the end of term
	performances.
	The year 8 focus text for term 3 will be Lord of the flies by William Golding. Students will be
	looking at the narrative as a whole as well as developing their drama techniques as well as
	character building skills. Students will be developing their knowledge of freeze frames and

	narration to create a whoosh performance of the story. Students will also progress their understanding and execution of more complexed techniques such as chorus.
Music	Year 8 have been developing their knowledge of harmony through working in their bands this term. They have learnt some basic chord progressions and composed some of their own, which they performed and created their own grooves to. This was followed by an exploration of texture through Hip Hop and Grime in the music technology suite, the students have recorded a mini portfolio of some very iconic tracks. This will help support the start of a very creative term after Christmas, when we will be learning some more sophisticated compositional devices through some popular Western Classical Traditions
PE	In Term 2/3, we develop and expand skills in the next set of sports in the learning journey. The main focus sports are basketball, gymnastics, and football. The students use the new holistic assessment system to identify their areas for improvement.
PSHE	Year 8 students are currently learning in Term 2 about substance abuse including drugs and alcohol, including the exploitation of young people by criminal gangs. They will then be exploring career options and equal opportunities. Term 3 offers education on discrimination in all its forms including racism, sexism, religious/disability, homophobia, transphobia and bi phobia.
