Much has been accomplished this past school year, and we anticipate great things to come as we wind down 2021! We moved into two new elementary schools at Kellogg and Richland and christened a new building remodel at Ryan Intermediate Elementary. Security

was upgraded across the District and our brand-new stateof-the-art Gull Lake Center for the Fine Arts is on track to be completed by mid-March. These new spaces are focused on teaching and learning and will create spaces for our entire community to gather, collaborate and participate intergenerationally in our lives together. These are just some of the many things our community can celebrate moving forward.

The Gull Lake Staff has considered it a privilege to serve our kids and community through some very trying times that stretched us and helped us learn how to make progress together. We are taking what we have learned and putting it to good use to help close learning gaps and build skills that lead to success. Our community knows how to pull together to get things done, and our kids benefit greatly as a result. One good example of getting things done is the new Vocational program being developed collaboratively in our region. The Gull Lake team has been working closely with the Kalamazoo Regional Educational Services Agency and leaders of industry,

business, skilled trades, hospitality and health care to develop a centralized Career & Technical Center that will be located next door to the Wings Event Center. Sixteen programs have been identified that represent high demand well-paying jobs in our region.

Another pilot project in partnership with the Gull Lake Area Rotary Club is the Dream Careers mentoring program. This program matches students with talented area career professionals to explore and evaluate specific pathways of interest. Our mission and vision at Gull Lake Community Schools is to help students deeply engage and invest in their learning as a lifelong habit. We value our Community Partners and their contributions in this process.

I want to extend an invitation to community members to come and tour our new and remodeled school facilities if you have an interest in seeing the outstanding results of our capital bond project. You can contact Central Office and we will schedule a time to tour together.





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

Tesi Klipsch – Early College Parent

We moved to the Gull Lake School District when our oldest, Trysten, was mid-way through 8th grade. As he entered high school, I started hearing more about the Early College program and was immediately intrigued for a few reasons.

The first is that we have 5 children within 5 sequential school years. Tuition costs have skyrocketed over the last decade and we knew, should all 5 kids decide to attend college, we would need help shouldering the financial burden. Early College was an answer to that!

The second is that, anecdotally, I've known very few people in my life who knew what they wanted to do at 18-years-old. I know even fewer who started with one college major as an incoming freshman and finished with that major upon graduation. I didn't like the idea of my kids being in so much student loan debt from their first years of college as they tried different classes to see what fit. Early College was an answer to that, too!

My oldest 3 are currently in the Early College program. Trysten is in his 13th/final year at KVCC. After the spring semester next year, Trysten will enter a 4-year institution with 10 more credits than his peers, and he'll have done it for free! Tomas, a senior in high school, is in the middle of the program. Tariku, a junior in high school, is in his first year of the program.

I honestly cannot speak highly enough of the administrators, the support staff, and the entire program. From the moment you express interest to the end, your kids are supported and encouraged. It's such a great bridge between youth and adulthood as it gives the young people a safety net with adults checking in on them and being there as resources, but there is also so much independence being found in scheduling classes and making decisions themselves, too.

Honestly, I'll never understand why everyone in the Gull Lake school district isn't taking advantage of this incredible program. Thanks so much to everyone in the district involved in creating, implementing, and continuing this gift for our community. We appreciate you!


