

Liberty Christian is dedicated to a robust, innovative STEM program that spans from Preschool to Upper School. STEM courses are designed to help students understand, interpret, create, and collaborate in a technology-rich, project-based environment. Known on campus as Warrior GRID, our STEM program intersects innovation and inspiration. It exists to inspire students to become lifelong learners and problem-solvers, while instilling a strong sense of curiosity, confidence, tenacity, and teamwork. As innovators and risk-takers, students are encouraged to become creators of technology and not just consumers, while using design thinking to conquer interesting and challenging missions.



Relationships—Key to Learning

Teaching with Compassion and Excellence

At Liberty Christian, we understand that connection matters. Our faculty builds positive relationships with students, as encouraging bonds significantly impact students' lives, both academically and socially. Confident students who understand their value perform better and approach learning with avid curiosity.

Our professional Christian educators recognize students learn in different ways, and gain knowledge and skills through a variety of teaching styles. Our teachers help students develop an enthusiasm for learning and an ability to make connections between subjects.

Liberty Christian's faculty and staff lead and love by example. We see parents and grandparents as our partners in education. No matter the subject, our classes intentionally display the lens of a biblical worldview to help students develop empathy and compassion as they navigate the complex world in which we live. We each play a role in helping students live up to the calling of loving God and others. We believe students who can think critically, act responsibly, and serve wholeheartedly will excel not only in the classroom, but also as Christian leaders in whatever career they pursue.

As part of our efforts to support each student at Liberty, all K-12 students participate in a mentoring program. Students in grades 5-12 meet twice per month with an assigned teacher, administrator, or staff member to set and review goals, ensure progress, and encourage the success of the student. These meetings help train students on how to set goals, reflect, and make adjustments while aiming to build healthy relationships and support students in their character and academic achievement.

Primary School Preschool-Bridge

Liberty Christian believes every child is uniquely designed as a gift from God. For students aged 3 to 5, we offer a high quality preschool education in a warm, nurturing environment with Christian guidance and encouragement.

Our creative curriculum encourages growth spiritually, intellectually, emotionally, socially, and physically. We want our preschoolers to learn academic fundamentals, grow in social maturity, understand that Jesus loves them, and develop an intellectual curiosity that solidifies a foundation of lifelong learning.

Students must be 3 years old to enter Preschool, or 4 years old to enter Prekindergarten, and be fully potty-trained. Students must be 5 years old to enroll in the optional Bridge class.

Preschool (Age 3) and Pre-K (Age 4): Our theme-based, scholastic curriculum encourages children to think, reason, question, and problem solve through play and exploration. In small groups and through individual instruction, our interactive learning centers stimulate curiosity and build the foundations of learning, including language and math experiences, science exploration, creative art, music and movement, dramatic play, and language fundamentals. Pre-K introduces cognitive skills and helps children practice decision making.

Bridge (Age 5): This optional class provides a bridge between Pre-K and kindergarten. The Bridge class offers students time to develop foundational skills needed for success in an age and developmentally appropriate setting. Students will not only learn essential pre-literacy, pre-math, and other cognitive skills, but will also develop social and self-regulation skills needed to succeed in school and life. Because we want children to flourish as confident communicators and lifelong learners, we know some students need more time to develop the vital social skills and learning fundamentals required for kindergarten.

Spiritual Life makes the difference.

A dedicated pastor serves Primary School. Through monthly chapels, children experience joyful, exuberant worship and Bible lessons applicable for their age level. Spiritual Life in Preschool focuses on the lifelong love, joy, and peace that come from personally knowing God. Students also complete a chapel art project to help them deepen their understanding of each month's chapel theme. Students learn a Bible verse each week and also celebrate God's love together during Praise and Worship weekly.



Primary School Kingergarten-5th Grade

With love, care, and nurture as a hallmark, students in kindergarten to 5th grade grow academically, socially, emotionally, physically, and spiritually.

Primary School fosters a lifelong love of learning. With the belief that every child is fearfully and wonderfully made (Psalm 139:14), teachers engage students in classroom experiences that honor each child's learning through the use of small group and differentiated instruction. We want students to leave Primary School with a love for the Lord and a confidence that they can make our world a better place.

Spiritual Life

In addition to daily Bible time, Primary School students participate in chapels and spiritual life classes with the Primary School Pastor. The spiritual life focus, during these formative years, is discipleship. We want students to build a firm foundation of God's truth from the Bible and the Holy Spirit, as we mentor students into authentic, genuine, Christ-centered believers.

Liberty Learning Center

The Liberty Learning Center provides services to students in kindergarten to 5th grade who have diagnosed learning differences. The Liberty Learning Center's mission empowers students with strategies and skills to overcome learning differences to achieve academic success. Services vary based on each child's academic needs, but could include classroom accommodations, access to the testing center, small group remediation, in-class support, and individually targeted instructional support.

Missions Day Partnerships

Each grade in K to 5 participates in a missions field trip each year. Examples include helping at Good Samaritan Village in Denton, Christian Community Action in Lewisville, and Mission Arlington.

Liberty Christian prioritizes physical fitness for its students to promote a lifestyle of health and wellness. Primary School students enjoy P.E. classes every other day and recess every day.



Learning Center teachers collaborate with classroom teachers and parents throughout the school year to adjust plans as needed and guide students toward a lifelong love of learning.

Unique Weekly Enrichments to Supplement Academic Instruction

Vocal Music, Musical Theatre, Applied Music

Vocal Music and Musical Theatre classes offer students opportunities for performance. Students build confidence and skills in singing, acting, and reading music. This class focuses on creative expression and performance skills. In Applied Music class, students sing, move, and play instruments as they explore the world of music and learn the essentials of rhythm, pitch, and harmony.

Art

In visual arts, students learn to draw with a variety of media as they explore patterns and texture. As students progress through Primary School, lessons include principles of symmetry, negative and positive space, portraiture, and color awareness. Students also experiment with painting and sculpture.

Spanish

Because language and culture are at the heart of the human experience, Liberty Christian believes every student should develop proficiency in another language. Primary School Spanish provides cultural lessons and foundational language tools and vocabulary students will need to understand and converse in Spanish.

STEM Grid Lab

Liberty Christian uses the Project Lead the Way curriculum to engage students in weekly STEM learning. The program empowers students to adopt a design-thinking mindset through compelling activities and projects that build upon each other and relate to the world around them. As students engage in hands-on activities in computer science, engineering, and biomedical science, they become creative, collaborative problem solvers ready to take on any challenge. This curriculum aligns with Liberty Christian's Middle and Upper School STEM courses.

Liberty Youth Athletics (LYA) provides Preschool and Primary School students an opportunity to experience team sports. LYA teaches sports fundamentals, teamwork, commitment, fitness, self-esteem, and fair play in a Christian environment. Participation is optional. Costs vary by sport.

Middle School

The Middle School years represent one of the greatest periods of transition in life. Adolescent students need a learning environment designed specifically with them in mind. Liberty Christian's Middle School nurtures and encourages students while providing guidance and support.

Challenging academics and wide-ranging electives provide students a chance to explore their interests, learn to express themselves, and spark enthusiasm for lifelong learning. Middle School provides a training ground for the college-preparatory rigor ahead in Upper School. Students develop independence in learning, including time management and study skills.

Middle School also strives to capture students' hearts for Jesus. As students age, we know the pressures of the world increase. We want our students to recognize as early as possible their identity is in Christ, and they are each loved, valued, and uniquely designed by God.

Middle School Highlights

- Small classes: Students are known, seen, supported, and encouraged
- Block schedule: Courses rotate every other day (similar to Upper School and college)
- One-to-one iPad program (provided by Liberty Christian)
- Honors courses available in all academic core areas

- Students in 7th and 8th grade receive Upper School mentors from the Spiritual Life Department
- Electives: World languages, art, band, choir, athletics, musical theatre, broadcasting, Spirit Program for girls, and STEM

Middle School National Junior Honor Society

The National Junior Honor Society honors students for scholarship, leadership, service, and character. It provides an avenue for students to serve the community through various projects during the school year.



Middle School Athletics

All Middle School students may participate in athletics – a perfect time to take risks and try new sports. The primary focus of Middle School athletics teaches sports fundamentals and general team concepts in a Christian environment.

Middle School athletes gain important life skills and develop physical fitness habits. The Liberty Christian Athletics Department believes the lessons learned from athletic participation help students develop self-esteem, self-confidence, character, respect, sportsmanship, teamwork, and cooperation.

Middle School and Upper School Spiritual Life

Liberty Christian endeavors to bring children into a closer, personal relationship with Jesus Christ. We strive to guide our students on the path that God has for them by encouraging and supporting their faith in and out of the classroom.

With a serving spirit, Liberty Christian educates and raises up children to see the world – not as it is, but as it could be – when the love of God is lived out in their daily lives.

Liberty Christian provides a spiritual foundation, recognizing the importance of the local church and parent partnerships that enable students to understand who they are in Christ, always prepared to give an answer when asked, “Why Jesus?” We encourage servant leadership because we believe the best leaders are dedicated servants.

With intentionality, we teach God’s Word throughout the curriculum at all grade levels. Beginning in Middle School, our core curriculum includes Bible classes and Spiritual Life programs designed to equip students with the spiritual and intellectual capacity to passionately articulate, defend, and live out their faith. We want students to develop a love for God’s Word, healthy and consistent biblical practices, and a heart for service.

Middle and Upper School Programs

Pastors: Two youth pastors focus on building relationships with students to point them to Christ.

Chapel: Middle and Upper School chapels give students an opportunity to encounter Christ together through worship and praise.

Impact: The Impact program pairs Upper School leaders with 7th and 8th grade students for meaningful mentorship and spiritual accountability.

Grade-Level Retreats: The Spiritual Life Team hosts grade-level retreats each year for Middle School students and Upper School seniors. At these retreats, faith deepens and relationships form among students, teachers, and coaches.

Upper School

Spring Break Mission Trip: Students have the opportunity to participate in an annual international mission trip to serve and share the gospel. Students consistently describe this tradition as transformational and unforgettable.

Leadership Academy: This club develops leadership skills and deepens students' spiritual lives, providing a self-paced study that encourages students to explore leadership through Scripture. The program focuses on five core values: truth, community, purpose, discipleship, and character.



Upper School

Every aspect of Upper School prepares students for success in college and beyond, equipping them to discover and walk courageously on the unique path God has for each of them.

The Upper School curriculum readies students for a complex and complicated world. Our faculty members help students develop their critical-thinking and communication skills, equipping them to be disciplined and committed Christian leaders in whatever career they pursue.

Academic Guidance and College Counseling

Our dedicated team of advisors works with students, parents, and faculty to ensure students have the resources and support they need to successfully navigate the college planning process. Deciding which college to attend should be rewarding and positive. That's why Liberty Christian students begin the college-planning process in the spring semester of 8th grade by creating a four-year Upper School planning guide.

Service to others displays some of the most profound expressions of love in Scripture. We accept and review applications on a rolling basis throughout the academic year. Applicants who have a completed applications file by Dec. 15 will be eligible for Early Decision. Students eligible for Early Decision may continue the admissions process, and, if Liberty has confirmed openings in a grade level, may be issued an enrollment agreement for the upcoming school year. With many grades approaching capacity at Liberty, Early Decision is a wonderful opportunity to secure your student's consideration for acceptance.

Age Requirement

Students must be 3 years old to enter Preschool, 4 years old to enter Prekindergarten, or 5 years old to enter Bridge and be fully potty-trained for admittance.

Admissions Testing Requirement

If transcript grade requirements are not met, students are subject to additional testing. Liberty will require the student to take the MAP Test for further assessment.

General Information

Calendar and Hours

The academic calendar consists of 170 instructional days made up of two semesters that are each divided into two grading periods. Liberty Christian's school year typically begins in mid-August and ends before Memorial Day.

In Primary School, faculty members oversee before-care beginning at 7:30 a.m. to supervise students who arrive early. We provide optional after-care for Primary School students after school until 6 p.m. for an additional charge.

Cafeteria

Liberty Christian contracts with SAGE Dining Services to offer a variety of made-from-scratch meal options. Students may enjoy a wide selection of nutritious options, including a salad bar, a sandwich bar, and a hot menu bar, along with gluten-free and dairy-free options.

Liberty Locker / Uniforms

Families may purchase uniforms and spirit wear – with the exception of shoes, socks, and belts – at our on-campus store, the Liberty Locker, open from 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. on school days. Summer hours vary. Other than Preschool, Prekindergarten, and Bridge, we require school uniforms and provide a catalog at www.libertychristian.com/libertylocker. Once a year, the school also sponsors a Used Uniform Sale to give families the opportunity to buy and sell uniforms from each other at discounted prices.

Nurses Office

Two full-time nurses on staff support student health and wellness. The school utilizes the online SNAP Health Portal to maintain student medical records, track health information, and manage permissions to administer prescription and nonprescription medications.
