- Non-Resident Students: UTAH HOUSE BILL 144 [Non- Resident Tuition Waivers | Admissions \(utah.edu\)](http://utah.edu)
 - ❖ The Utah State Legislature passed House Bill 144 in 2002 which allows eligible Utah high school graduates the opportunity to attend Utah universities & colleges & have the non-resident portion of their tuition waived. A student can qualify for this waiver if they:
 - Attended a Utah high school for three or more years
 - Graduated or will graduate from a Utah high school or attained the equivalent of a high school diploma (GED) in Utah
 - Have not registered for college classes prior to the Fall 2002 academic school year.
 - Don not hold a current visa
 - Have filed or will file an application to legalize their immigration status as soon as they are eligible to do so

- Non-Resident Students: Utah Senate Bill 253
 - ❖ As of May 12, 2015, Utah SB 253 makes it so any student who graduates from a Utah high school (regardless of high school graduation year) IS NOT required to provide proof of lawful US presence for scholarships or tuition waivers in Utah’s public colleges & universities. Therefore, regardless if the student has or does not have DACA, as long as they have graduated from a Utah high school, they may apply to privately funded scholarships administered by a Utah public colleges or university!

- Non-Resident Students: Utah House Bill 118

- ❖ The House Bill 118 tuition waiver allows eligible Utah high school graduates the opportunity to attend Utah universities and colleges and have the non-resident portion of their tuition waived. A student can qualify for this waiver if they:
 - Are a foreign national legally admitted to the US (holds a non-immigrant visa such as F-1, H-4, J-1, etc.)
 - Attended a Utah high school for three or more years.
 - Graduated or will graduate from a Utah high school or attained the equivalent of a high school diploma (GED) in Utah.

Required documents for House Bill 118 tuition waiver:

- Completed House Bill 118 Form
- Official final high school transcripts with graduation dates or GED scores



UNIVERSITY OF UTAH – For Utah Scholarship

- Requirements –
 - High school minimum 3.2 GPA & Pell eligible (FAFSA)
 - Apply to college by priority December 1 deadline & FAFSA by February 1
- Maintain continuing eligibility
 - Maintains 3.0 GPA
 - Continues to be Pell eligible (FAFSA)
 - Enroll in 12.0 credit hours ea. Semester

BRIGHAM YOUNG UNIVERSITY -- BYU - Cougarpellpromise.byu.edu

- Qualifications – Be admitted to BYU as a freshman student by the first fall semester after high school graduation
- Complete the online scholarship application by the published scholarship deadline
- Complete FAFSA by January 20 & be Pell eligible
- Maintaining Continuing Eligibility
 - Complete online scholarship application ea. Year by continuing scholarship deadline
 - Complete FAFSA by January 20
 - Maintain a 2.0 cumulative BYU GPA
 - Enroll in 12.0 credit hours each semester

UTAH STATE – Utah State Promise (Available at all USU campuses)

The Utah State Promise is a “last dollar” scholarship, meaning it is applied to your remaining tuition & student body fees after all other aid is applied. What is considered other aid & what order is it applied? First, Federal Pell Grant (FAFSA), and then second, USU will apply other scholarships (e.g., institutional awards, department, Regents, outside/3rd party). After all aid & scholarships are applied, USU pays any remaining balance due.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- Submit FAFSA & be Pell Grant Eligible
- Utah resident, US citizen, or eligible non-citizen
- Be admitted as first-time incoming undergraduate
- Intend to graduate from USU
- Renewal for up to 4 years (must remain pell eligible, good standing-academics, up to full tuition & student body fees)

SOUTHERN UTAH UNIVERSITY – SUU – Access Utah Promise Scholarship

CRITERIA:

- Have a high school diploma or equivalent
- Have not received an associate degree or higher postsecondary degree
- Be a resident of Utah
- Must demonstrate financial need
- Accept all other grants, tuition/fee waivers, & scholarships offered to the applicant
- Maintain and meet Satisfactory Academic Progress

A RECIPIENT MAY RECEIVE SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS UNTIL ONE OF THE FOLLOWING OCCURS:

- Two years after the initial award
- A recipient uses the scholarship for four semesters
- A recipient meets the academic qualifications for an associate degree
- Or earns a cumulative total of 60 credits
- Recipients must submit FAFSA each year
 - Do verifications if needed

DIXIE STATE UNIVERSITY – TRAILBLAZER PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP

The Utah Promise Scholarship is the first-ever statewide needs-based scholarship program in Utah. It is available to recent high school graduates & adult learners at Utah's public colleges & universities, as well as Utah's public technical colleges. The Utah Promise Scholarship will cover up to tuition & fees for up to two years. The Trailblazer Promise is automatically awarded at DSU through a completed FAFSA Application to those who qualify. This process happens after the 3rd week of each semester. If you are awarded the Trailblazer Promise, you will receive an email from the Financial Aid Office to your Dmail account. There is no separate application required except a completed FAFSA Application.

UTAH VALLEY UNIVERSITY – UVU – Greenlight Scholarship

[Greenlight Scholarship | Financial Aid | Utah Valley University \(uvu.edu\)](#)

This scholarship fills the gap to cover tuition for students who receive the Pell Grant (FAFSA) but may still owe additional tuition. For students who qualify, the cost of a two-year degree will be covered by federal aid and UVU. Your first two years are covered!

- Eligibility
 - Complete the FAFSA and receive a Pell Grant each year
 - Be a Utah Resident
 - Enrolled on a full-time basis (at least 12 credits)
 - Priority given to first-year and second-year students admitted with a complete financial aid file by May 15
 - Must have attempted fewer than 60 credit hours
- How to apply
 - Be admitted to UVU
 - Complete the FAFSA & be awarded a Pell Grant by May 15 (to receive first priority)
 - No scholarship application is required. UVU will award the scholarships automatically
- Example:
 - UVU tuition per semester \$2,561
 - Student receives Pell Grant for \$1,000
 - Difference: \$1,561
 - UVU provides a scholarship for \$1,561
 - Tuition Balance: \$0

SALT LAKE COMMUNITY COLLEGE -- SLCC Promise: helps eligible students pay for their education by covering the cost of tuition & fees when federal grants fall short.

- Who's Eligible
 - Utah Resident
 - Receive a Federal Pell Grant
 - Take 9 or more credits in Fall & Spring semester or take 6 or more during summer
 - All SLCC students are encouraged to meet with an academic advisor
 - Maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA & complete 70% of attempted courses.

WEBER STATE UNIVERSITY -- DREAM WEBER --

The Dream Weber program provides free tuition & general student fees to students enrolled in 12 semester credits, who qualify for a Pell Grant & whose annual household income is \$40,000 or less. The amount awarded varies depending on each applicant's FAFSA, as the Dream Weber program supplements any other aid that is awarded.

How to Follow Your Dream (Weber)

1. Apply for admissions
2. Starting Sept. 1, apply for Dream Weber scholarship
3. Complete FAFSA
4. Check your email

Eligibility:

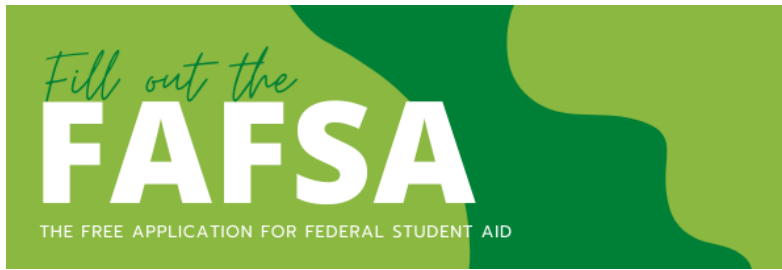
- Be a legal Utah resident
- Have a household income of \$40,000 or less
- Qualify for FAFSA – federal Pell Grant funds
- Be an undergraduate student with less than 150 credit hours

Maintaining Your Scholarship (reapply each year):

- Enroll & maintain a course load of 12-18 credit hours/semester
- Attain satisfactory academic standing & maintain a 2.0 GPA
- Qualify for Federal Pell Grant funds
 - Apply each year for federal funds – FAFSA
 - Complete WSU scholarship application

Conditions:

- Dream Weber covers the cost of full-time tuition (between 12-18 credit hours) & general student fees
- Eligibility continues for a total of 8 semesters or until you reach 150 semester hours

 - Driver's License
 - Alien Registration number if not a US citizen
 - For 2022-2023 school year:
 - 2020 Federal tax return – including IRS W-2
 - Yours (if you filed) & parents
 - IRS 1040 or
 - Foreign tax returns, IRS 1040NR, or IRS 1040NR-EZ
 - Tax return for Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the US Virgin islands, the Marshall Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia, or Palau
 - Records of your untaxed income, such as child support received, interest income, and veterans noneducation benefits, for you, & your parents if you are a dependent student
 - Information on cash; savings and checking account balances; investments, including stocks & bonds and real estate (but not including the home in which you live); and business and farm assets for you, and for your parents if you are a dependent student.

UTAH JAZZ SCHOLARSHIP

For every Jazz win during the 2020-2021 season, the Utah Jazz provided a full, four-year scholarship to students from an underrepresented group. Full scholarships were awarded to 30 students during the 2021-2022 school year. The remaining 31 scholarships, representing the rest of the team's wins last year, as well as scholarships that result from additional wins this season will be awarded at the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year.

CRITERIA:

- Graduate of a Utah High School
- Person of Color (Asian or Pacific Islander; Black or African American; Hispanic or Latinx; or Native American or Alaskan Native)
- Preference given to those with demonstrated financial need (regardless of FAFSA eligibility)
- Preference given to first-generation college students
- Incoming freshman enrolling as a full-time student for the 2022-2023 school year
- Admission to one of the six listed UT universities: BYU, SUU, Weber, U of U, USU, and/or UVU

AMOUNT:

- Full cost of attendance – including tuition, books, fees & room/board – for each recipient's full undergraduate education at one of six universities in the state of Utah.

OPENS: November 15, 2021

DEADLINE: TBD

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- One letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, coach, or mentor
- Short video of approx. 1-2 min. with the applicant responding to ONE of the following prompts:
 - Talk about an obstacle you faced and how you overcame it.
 - What do you hope to accomplish after you graduate from college?
 - Who is someone who has had a major influence on your life? Explain their impact & your relationship with them.
- Unofficial high school transcript
- Financial aid information, such as SAR (Student Aid Report) from FAFSA or FAFSA 4Caster

DELL SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Recognizes academic potential and determination in students that have a definite need for financial assistance.

CRITERIA:

- Senior with demonstrated need for financial assistance.
- 2.4 GPA required
- US Citizen or permanent resident
- Must be participating in an approved college readiness program (Gear Up, AVID, Upward Bound/Trio) for a minimum of two years.

AMOUNT: \$20,000

OPENS: October 1, 2021

DEADLINE: December 1

The Empowerment Program is a five-year program that provides – at no cost to the students – a comprehensive network of support & practical guidance to assist Scholars in their transition from high school to college, & from college to future professional or academic paths.

CRITERIA:

- High-achieving and service-focused juniors
- 3.0 GPA
- Demonstrate financial need. Household's adjusted gross income should be LESS than \$100,000/year
- Essay and letters of recommendation
- They welcome applicants who reside in the US, regardless of citizenship status; must be attending a US high school
- Committed to participating in rigorous five-year curriculum and able to attend New York Leader Week July 9-14, 2022.

AMOUNT: \$500 awarded twice at entrance & exit, receive a laptop, and free travel, room and board to leadership camps every summer.

DEADLINE: Jan 26, 2022

CRITERIA:

- Senior in high school
- Achieved at least one of the following: (1) ranked in the top 25% of class (2) ACT score of 24 or SAT score of 1100 (3) minimum of B+ average
- Applicant must have participated in two sports for two years in each sport
- Have received at least one varsity letter in each of two sports
- Must complete attached scholar/essay application
- Must have a letter of recommendation from the high school athletic administrator/director
- School athletic administrator/director must be an NIAAA member & a member of their respective state athletic administrators association
- Principal or athletic administrator/director must sign the application to ensure that the academic information submitted is accurate
- All hard copy materials must be post-marked or electronic materials sent to the NIAAA Liaison in your respective state by your states deadline.

AMOUNT:

- State Winners: one male and one female will each receive a plaque recognizing them as state winners
- Section Winners: One male and one female in each of the eight NIAAA sections will each receive a \$1500 scholarship & a plaque
- National Winners: One male and one female will be selected from the eight section winners to each receive a \$2500 scholarship, glass etching recognizing them as national winners, & attend the National Conference for Athletic Administrators in December to present essay.

Thus the U strives to attract students who have the ability to contribute to and benefit from a culturally & intellectually diverse learning community. Our goal is to make every attempt to support the student's academic and personal success while enrolled at the U.

CRITERIA:

- Senior students
- Must be admitted to the University of Utah
- Must be a Utah resident for the academic year for which they are applying
- Demonstrate financial need
- Undocumented or US citizens with financial need planning to attend the U of U whose ethnic background is under-represented in higher education or those who are first generation students of a diverse background

PLEASE PROVIDE:

- Personal statement essay (1000 words maximum) in which you address your educational & career goals, your family background, and the reason why you believe you are qualified for this scholarship.
- Letters of Recommendation are required – references can speak to your academic or leadership abilities
- Emergency Contact Information (Name & Phone Number)
- Current Student Status (next academic year)
