Date: December 2, 2021

As discussed during the September 28 and October 12 regular meetings of the Board of Education, curriculum governance is a paramount responsibility shared by members of the Board. Following the establishment of a BOE Curriculum Committee, our first meeting will include items related to curriculum infrastructure: the leadership and processes involved in curriculum development and revision.

The presentation and attached slide deck includes a graphic representing the structure of human resource leadership and collaboration in the curriculum process. Additionally, information regarding curriculum drivers for revision as well as a closer look of the development process itself will be discussed.

To streamline processes and bring more transparency to curriculum, information regarding EduPlanet21, a curriculum warehousing program, will be shared. To learn more about EduPlanet 21 prior to the meeting, please feel free to view this brief three minute [video](#).

While the Board as a whole will continue to vote on matters regarding curriculum, the committee may choose to identify their specific charge in supporting this work. When the formation of the curriculum committee was decided earlier this fall, the following were recommendations made by the administration to focus that work.

- receive and/or request curriculum studies or presentations on specific topics
- review data to determine curriculum effectiveness
- review curriculum updates from summer institutes
- review curriculum of newly approved courses
- ensure policy alignment

Moving forward we look forward to establishing a regular cycle of updates to guide the general workflow over the course of the year. Specific content and program areas will be presented regularly as well as items supporting new course development and the budget development process.

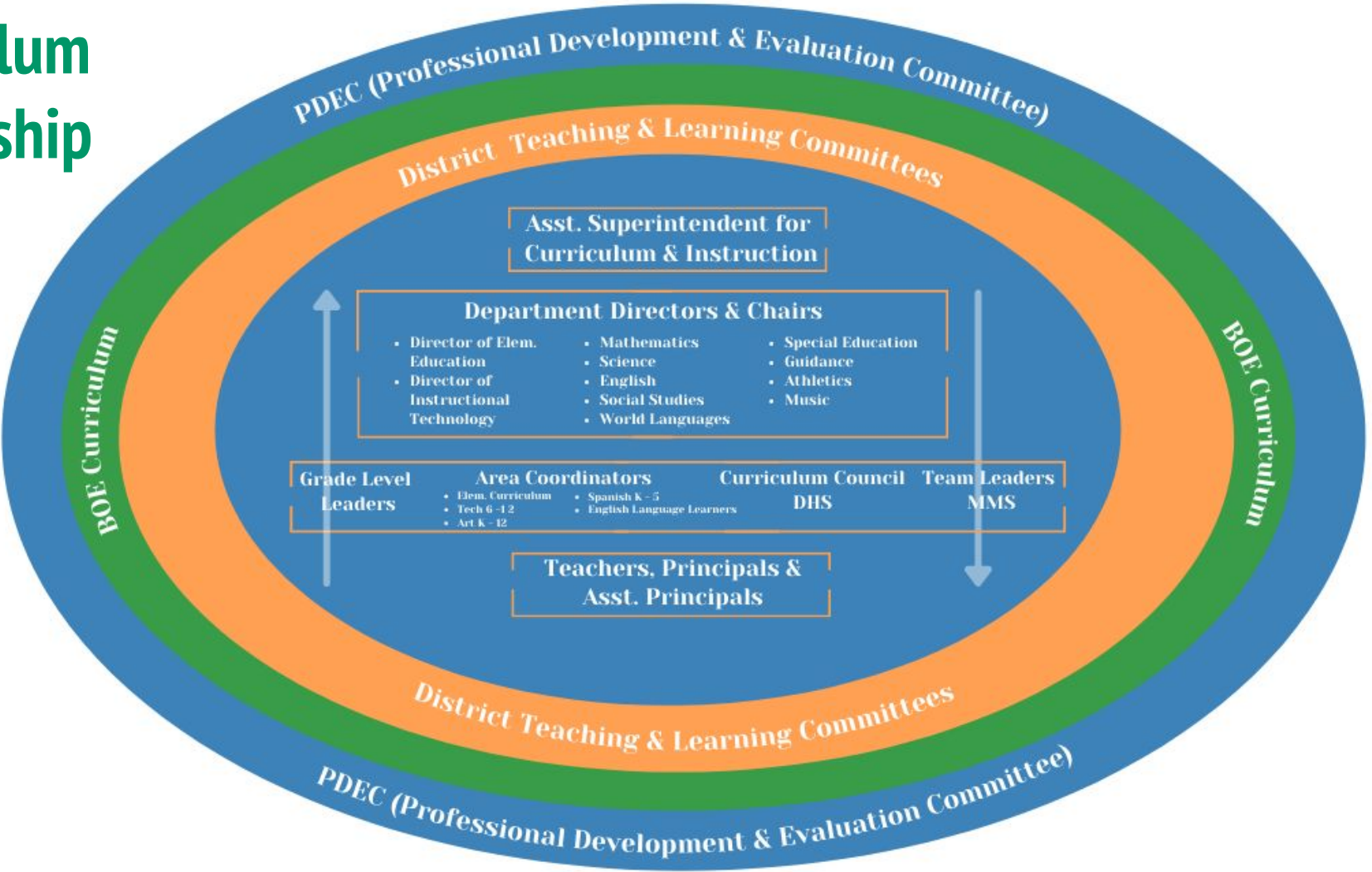

  - feedback driven

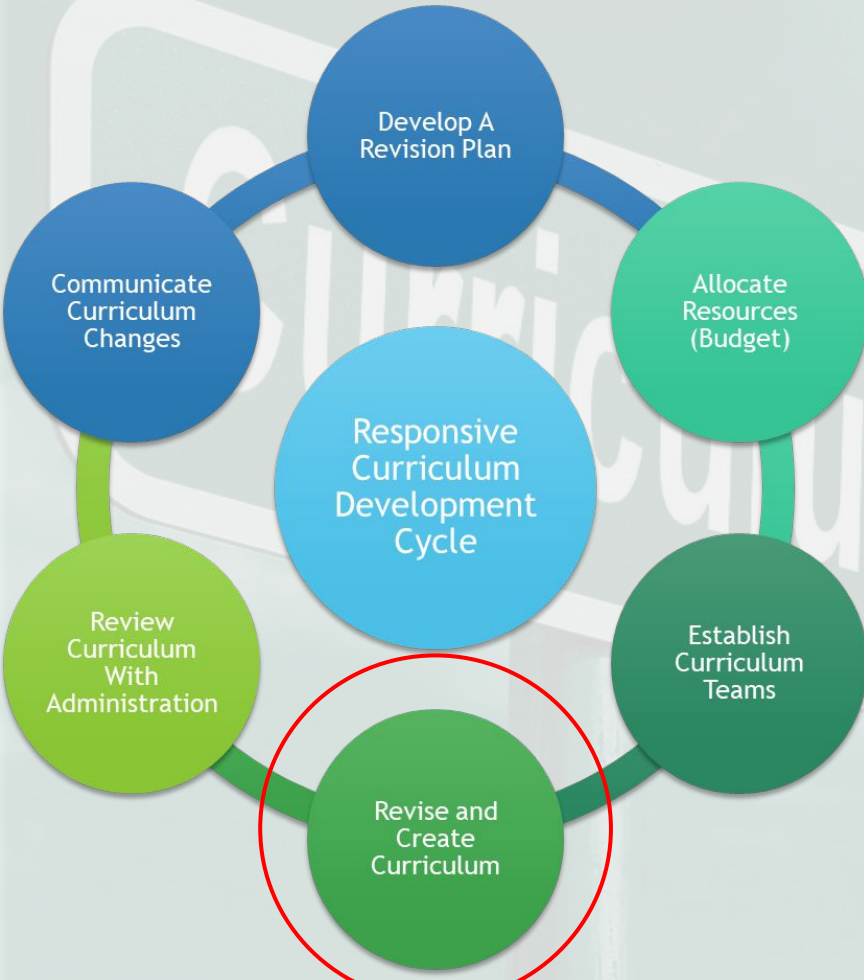
# Curriculum Drivers
