Marian Catholic High School is a Catholic, coeducational, college preparatory high school within the Dominican tradition of study, prayer, community, and preaching. #### **Admission**

Admission to Marian Catholic is selective. In addition to taking a competitive entrance exam, other factors such as previous standardized test results and grade school report cards are examined. The average score achieved on the STS High School Placement Test by all admitted students is the 50th percentile nationally. Marian Catholic does not discriminate on the basis of gender, race, or ethnic origin.

### **Enrollment/Diversity**

Marian Catholic has a total enrollment of 903 students representing 69 different zip codes within the states of Illinois and Indiana. The school enjoys a rich cultural and geographic diversity as students enroll from many public, private, urban, and suburban grade schools. Approximately 71% of our students are of Latino, African American, or Asian ethnicities, some of whom are international students.

### **Faculty**

Marian Catholic's faculty serve as mentors in and out of the classroom. The average teaching experience is 12 years with 73% holding a Master's Degree or higher. The student teacher ratio is 14:1.

### Fourth Quarter 2019-2020

During the 4th quarter, Marian Catholic pivoted to remote learning on March 16, 2020 following the school's closure due to COVID-19. Students followed their school schedule, attending classes online from 7:45 a.m. to 2:20 p.m. each day. Marian Catholic's students continued to be graded on all assignments and tests.

### 2020-2021 Academic Year

This school year, Marian Catholic has adopted a hybrid schedule. Students were allowed to choose between attending school remotely full-time or attending in-person classes every other day. On the alternate day, students attend class remotely.


