

Blood Donor Ambassador Playbook



Purpose

The purpose of this document is to provide guidance, resources and answer frequently asked questions about the Blood Donor Ambassador position. This playbook supplements the information you learned in the Blood Donor Ambassador Training.

Introduction

Communities across the country count on the American Red Cross for help every day; supporting those communities is at the heart of what we do. Our work never stops, even during this COVID-19 crisis.

Whether supplying blood products for patients in need of transfusions--including those who need surgery, cancer treatments, or trauma victims--or collecting plasma from individuals fully recovered from COVID-19 to help with treatment for the most seriously ill patients, we remain focused on delivering our lifesaving mission each day.

The included topics will help you support blood donors AND protect yourself and others from the risk of COVID-19 while still collecting the lifesaving blood products communities need.

COVID-19 Guidelines effective 08/02/2021

Effective Monday, August 2, we will require all employees and volunteers to wear a face mask at our offices, facilities, blood drives and any indoor operations while engaging in services on behalf of the Red Cross.

Guidance

Role: The Blood Donor Ambassador will provide excellent customer service to enhance the blood donor experience in several ways

- 1. Welcome, help donors check-in and inform on how to maximize their donation
- 2. Assist Collections Team members by sanitizing and disinfecting
- 3. <u>Support donors in Hospitality</u> to provide re-hydration, check time in canteen <u>and</u> monitor the donor for possible adverse reactions
- 4. <u>Assist Donor Recruiting</u> by calling donors who have not arrived for their appointment or whose appointment needs to be cancelled

<u>Time commitment</u>: is variable; preferred commitment: 1+ shift/month, average shift is 5-6 hours.

Onboarding & Training: online training including the role's pre-screening process, staffing the reception and hospitality areas, donor area and donor bed disinfecting and donor calling.



Training Expectations


- 1) **Review the Blood Donor Ambassador role**--Reception and Hospitality expectations, COVID-19 procedures, and donor calling on the day of the drive.
- 2) Ensure you have reviewed the training video and this playbook.
- 3) Ensure you have a volunteer name tag during the drive

<u>Blood Donor Ambassador Training</u>: before your first shift, be sure to watch the training video (about 35 minutes) to ensure you are equipped to serve in this important volunteer role.

Watch Training Video

<u>Engagement</u>: Sign up for shifts in the Volunteer Connection Shift Tool, engage in additional training as needed. You will receive weekly surveys after your shifts to see how things went.

Responsibilities: outlined in training and below





Maximize The Donation



Check-In Donor

Step 1 Donor reads the information presented on the stop sign Step 3 Donor cleans hands with sanitizer and then checks-in. Donor scans own ID

Step 5 Thank the Donor for completing check-in and for coming in to donate the gift of life













Step 2 Donor completes RapidPass or reads the Pre-Donation Information

Step 4 Complete a name sticker with time the donor finished checking in. If walk-ins allowed: print W on sticker





Disinfect Reception & Hospitality Areas*

STEP 1

ALWAYS wear disposable gloves and avoid contact between clothing and sanitizer

STEP 2

If surfaces are visibly dirty, they should be cleaned using a detergent or soap and water prior to disinfecting

STEP 3

Use Sani Cloths or Cavi Wipes in biomed environments

STEP 4

Rub the cloth against the surfaces and allow disinfectant to remain on the surface

DO <u>NOT</u> WIPE THE SURFACE DRY UNTIL THE GERM 'KILL' TIME HAS ELAPSED

STEP 5

After disinfecting the area, remove and throw away disposable gloves


Clean hands after removing gloves



Sanitize: tables, chairs, reading material, pens & markers, and Donor Tablets.


Clean Donor Check-In laptop and with 70% Isopropyl prep pad

*Always check with blood drive chargeperson if unsure






Volunteer Responsibilities in Hospitality Area

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How are we managing the health questions to ensure my health is suitable for the assignment?

A: The Biomed Volunteer Workforce Engagement (BVWE) Team is providing information found in the <u>Volunteer Screening Measures</u> (Donor Deferral column) to the you in advance of assignment.

Q: Will I be given all of the appropriate protective equipment for the assignment?

A: Yes, the Collections Team Member, or the Chargeperson for the blood drive will provide what is deemed appropriate: masks if you're unvaccinated, gloves, disinfecting wipes.

Q: Can I provide my own mask?

A: Staff and volunteers can bring their own disposable particle mask, surgical mask or N95 mask. The drive chargeperson is required to approve the mask if it is not provided by the American Red Cross to ensure it is one of the approved types.



Q. Are masks optional?

A. For your protection, and the protection of others, those in a donor facing role including staff, volunteers and sponsors, **must wear masks**.

Q: What training will a Blood Donor Ambassador receive? Who will provide the training?

A: Blood Donor Ambassadors can view online training information ahead of the first shift. Blood Donor Ambassadors will then be provided on-site-instruction from Collections staff to ensure understanding for your role that day.

Q: Will Blood Donor Ambassadors be asked to do things outside of the traditional position description such as surface cleaning?

A: Volunteers may be asked to support the blood drive in a number of ways. At this time, if asked, surface cleaning and disinfecting would apply to chairs, tables, unregulated areas like reception and hospitality and donor areas/donor beds.
