
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LSI News - What's the word?

3. Do you have any tips for the future president?


"My tips for the future president would be that make sure when you are signing up for it you will enjoy it if you do actually become President. And when you do become President just try to become more involved with the school."

That concludes this message, Happy Thanksgiving everyone and have a great break, Lobos!!




Sports Report

Book Recommendation



Did you know that in 2019, eleven states legalized the use of marijuana? These laws makes people believe that marijuana is safe causing people to use the drug more than they should, especially with the great risks they have. Marijuana has a chemical called delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol or THC. Like most other drugs that contain this chemical, marijuana rewires the brain causing the user to have attention problems, slower reaction time, less hand-eye coordination, poor memory, making things new things harder to learn and bad decision making.

But the danger today is greater than the dangers it posed 30 years ago. With more than three times the THC and because a teen's brain is still developing, this stage of life is a critical learning time which means everything they do now is easier to learn than doing it in adulthood. Using drugs can negatively affect the growth of the brain permanently and the addiction risk is four to seven times higher for teens than adults. This is because THC releases a chemical in the brain that causes cravings and addiction making the road to quitting marijuana a lot more harder. 
