**OUR SCHOOL:**

MOT Charter High School officially opened in 2014 as a successful expansion of our notable K-8 program, originally founded in 2002 as a Delaware Accredited Public Charter School. Our student-centered, challenging, college-preparatory program offers a rigorous, collaborative, and problem-based approach to learning. An immersive environment requiring self-direction and engagement supports students in developing their abilities and passions in order to become independent critical thinkers, problem solvers, and communicators who are well-equipped to excel in higher education, the workplace, and life in general.

**OUR COMMUNITY:**

Located in Middletown, Delaware, a suburban community of approximately 24,200 residents, MOT Charter draws, by lottery, a wide variety of over 700 students from more than 35 state schools and two counties. Our current students represent a diverse but cohesive school community, with 46% of students identifying as students of color. All of our full-time faculty are certified, with over 50% holding advanced degrees.

**POST HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT:**

Over the past four years, an average of 99% of our graduates have been accepted to college. In the class of 2023, 86% matriculated to 4-year colleges, 7% matriculated to 2-year institutions, and 7% selected work, military service, or technical instruction.

## MAJOR PATHWAYS

### ACADEMY OF THE ARTS

Our Academy of the Arts engages students in choosing one of the following majors:

Theater, Vocal or Instrumental Music, Dance, Business/Marketing, Digital Media, or Visual Art. Students can participate in art expos, theatrical and musical performances, and various community-based outreach presentations. All students in the Arts Academy minor in Digital Business/Marketing. Upon completion of specific coursework and an independent project, students have the opportunity to minor in Pre-Medicine.

### ACADEMY OF THE SCIENCES

Our Academy of the Sciences engages students in choosing one of the following majors: Engineering, Computer Science, or Biotechnology. Students can participate in STEM expos, Engineering Night, and other competitions and demonstrations. All students in the STEM Academy take courses in Engineering and Computer Programming and have the option to minor in Business/Marketing. Upon completion of specific coursework and an independent project, students have the opportunity to minor in Pre-Medicine.

## CURRICULUM FEATURES

### EARLY COLLEGE COURSES

Juniors and seniors may take up to two online early college courses through Wilmington University, University of Delaware, or West Virginia University. Earned college credit is reflected on both the student's high school transcript (0.5 credit, per course) and transcript from the University.

### ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Students must meet eligibility criteria to enroll in AP courses including grades, teacher recommendation, and the completion of summer work.

The following AP courses are currently offered: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Literature & Composition, Language & Composition, U.S. History, World History, Computer Science Principles, Computer Science A, Calculus AB, and Calculus BC.

### DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES

The Class of 2023 had the opportunity to earn college credits from Wilmington University and University of Delaware as part of their high school coursework. Earned college credit is reflected on both the student's high school transcript and a separate transcript from the college.

### HONORS COURSES

Students can self-select enrollment in honors courses as a freshman or sophomore, where applicable. As juniors, all students self-selected honors or AP for their history, English, and science coursework.

In March of 2020, MOT Charter began online instruction due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This continued until students transitioned back to in-person school in the Fall of 2021. The grading policy for the 2019-2020 school year was as follows:

Pass: Final course grade of A through D. A final grade of "Pass" does not factor into cumulative GPA calculations.  
No Credit: Replaces an F. Student does not earn credit for the course. If the course is a graduation requirement, students will have to retake the course. A final grade of "No Credit" does not factor into cumulative GPA calculations. No Credit option was continued for 2020-2021 school year.
