2. Approval of Last Meeting Minutes
Holly Dunham motioned to approved the minutes. Cindy Davis seconded the motion. The motion to approve the minutes passed unanimously.
3. Discussion and Nomination of SHAC Co-Chair
Cindy Davis nominated Lindsey Fox as co-chair and Max Rutherford seconded. No other discussion or nominations were given. Lindsey accepted the nomination and the committee was unanimously in favor of her being named co-chair.
4. New Business/Reports
 - A. COVID Update:
The active cases have decreased dramatically in this district. CSISD has provided vaccination clinics once a month. The next ones are on December 4th and January 8th.
 - B. Campus Safety: Threat Assessment
TEA and School Safety Center have created a task for districts in regards to threat assessments. There were 47 threats required, most of them occurred at the elementary. A task force must meet to determine levels of threats and next steps to support the student.
 - C. Waco/Mclennan County Health Department:
We have a direct connection with this department to do the COVID vaccination clinics. The health department is going to keep these clinics here in China Spring as long as they can but will be requiring people to come in to clinics in the future.
 - D. Social Services Liaison:
Cindy Davis is our health services liaison for the district. We will start our parent summits in the spring so presenters can speak to these topics.
 - a. Mental Health – House Bill 18

Cindy Davis is collaborating with representatives from the community to provide resources and information for the district.

Chad Paek - MHMR representative spoke about a class, Youth Mental Health First Aid, they can provide for mental health and gave survey data that 98% of people who attended this class found it helpful. The course is 2 hours online and 6 hours in person. This will meet the requirement of House Bill 18 to educate the teachers in mental health.

Lori Rockwood - Freedom Reigns spoke about the services they provide for the students and the benefits to be able to provide services in school.

Casandra Darlin - Texans Recovering Together discussed the program and how it provides counseling and other resources for COVID and/or the winter storm.

Bianca Martinez is working on a page on the website to provide a hub with all the resources that could benefit the district, is putting together a resource day for families, and is scheduling a time with Dr. Battle to come speak at one of our parent summit nights. These summit nights will start at the end of January.

David Baker – Licensed Professional Counselor is partnering with the Education Service Center to provide school based mental health training and is teaching about different forms of trauma and the impact on learning.

b. Dating Violence/Sexual Assault – Senate Bill 9

We have added what we are doing for dating violence and sexual assault into our District Improvement Plan and will continue to address the needs of our students.

c. Drugs/Alcohol – Senate Bill 435

The district takes a hard stance on drugs and alcohol.
