A HISTORY OF NEW BRITAIN



New Britain was settled in 1687 before becoming a city in 1871. In the early 1900s, New Britain became home to manufacturers such as Stanley Works, P&F Corbin Company, and North & Judd, earning renown as the hardware capital of the world. Immigrants filled

thousands of positions in the "Hardware City," starting their lives in America right here in New Britain, CT.

New Britain is home to many firsts, including the first wire coat hanger, invented in 1869 by O.A. North, and the technique of dribbling in basketball, which was developed at the New Britain YMCA in 1895. The City covers 13.4 square miles and is home to approximately 73,000 residents. In addition to the world headquarters of Stanley Black and Decker, New Britain is also home to Central Connecticut State University, more than 1,200 acres of natural park land, the largest Polish business district outside of Chicago, the Museum of American Art and the New Britain Bees of the Independent Baseball League. In 2021, we will celebrate our sesquicentennial and plan to have a year's worth of celebrations set forth to commemorate the milestone.

A HISTORY OF THE HIVE The Origin of the City Seal

On March 26, 1873, two years after the incorporation of New Britain, the Common Council adopted the recommendation of a special committee tasked with establishing a City seal and flag. The committee created a flag in predominately red and gold emblazoned with the City motto, "Industry fills the hive and enjoys the honey." That phrase was penned by Elihu Burritt, a New Britain native commonly known as the "Learned Blacksmith," and it stems from the "worker bees" who



helped to transform New Britain into the hardware capital of the world over the first half of the 20th century. If you look closely at the seal, you can see seven bees, which represent New Britain's seven founding factories: the Stanley Works; Fafnir Bearing; Landers, Frary, and Clark; Corbin Russwin; North & Judd Manufacturing; the New Britain Machine Company; and Skinner Precision Industries.


Halloween Trick-Or-Treat Safe Zone (October)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS City Hall Assistance

Where do I pay my taxes and any fees I owe to the City?

You can pay your tax bills either online at newbritainct.gov, or you can go directly to the Tax Collectors office on the first floor of City Hall (27 West Main Street).

How do I sign my children up for different activities sponsored by the City?

Our Parks and Recreation Department handles summer activities, after school programs, before school programs, and other events across the City. They can be found on the third floor of City Hall, or reached by phone at (860) 826-3360. You can always visit www.nbparksnrec.org to see what seasonal program offerings are available and register online.

Where can I get land records, property history, tax codes, city history, and other documents?

The Town Clerk's Office possesses just about every record or file the City has ever had. The office is located on the first floor of City Hall and they can assist you with your own personal records, such as birth certificates, veteran paperwork, such as DD-214s, and public land records. These items can also be accessed online through the City website at newbritainct.gov/townclerk.

Who do I call if my trash or recycling wasn't picked up?

The City of New Britain has a contract with a third-party provider, CWPM, for all trash and recycling purposes. Any trash and/or recycling-related questions or concerns should be referred to their main line at (860) 747-1335.

How do I get information on low-income housing, disability housing, or job and educational assistance?

The City's Community Services Department offers a variety of services to help with those in need of relief. They can be reached at (860) 826-3366 and are located on the third floor of City Hall in room 301.

How do I make a complaint or report a blight issue?

Call our Health and Building Department at (860) 826-3383 to file the blight complaint and have the issue resolved, or download our See-Click-Fix app to report issues.

I'm a veteran; am I eligible for any sort of relief or program through the City?

Thank you for your service to our country! We have a full-time Veterans Affairs Clerk in our Parks and Recreation Department who can help answer questions for veterans about what they may be eligible for through the City. The direct line is (860) 826-3662.

Facilities & Energy Public Safety Improvements Program


